However, nothing came across my desk last school year with regard to this. So please pay your tuition in a timely manner.

Continued from Priesthood Sunday Last Weekend

A Day in the Life of a priest:

An ordinary day for this priest out here on the frontier. Deposited Sunday's collection and took out some for the bake sale coming up in a couple weeks. Called the diocese with questions regarding an aspect of marriage prep. Began laying the groundwork for my Sunday homily. Prayed the Breviary morning, afternoon, and evening.

Went to the hardware store to by some mousetraps. A young man came up to me in the aisle, an employee of the store, and said, "I know you!" I asked from where and he said, "The jail; I was there, and you came for Bible study." We shook hands and he continued to grip mine as he shared that he got this job after two and a half years of trying, and now is staying out of trouble and making enough money to take care of his kids, and he's taking care of his brother's kids, too. He wanted to let me know how good his life was now, and I congratulated him.

Celebrated Mass and had two people, which is a 100% increase of the usual Wednesday evening congregation.

Had dinner with my Jesuit brothers, and then went to the hospital to bring Eucharist to a sick parishioner. Before I left she texted me: "Could you bring a Milky Way? I'm craving chocolate bad." I had two bucks in my pocket; on my way into the gas station a young man asked for a quarter; I promised him my change once I'd made my purchase. As I was leaving, another young man walked by and dug a quarter out of his pocket, too.

On the edge of town I saw a man walking on the side of the road; he signaled for a ride. I usually don't offer rides to people unless it is a mother with children, since you don't know if a person is drunk, high, or coming off of drugs and could be dangerous. But for some reason I didn't even think about any of those possibilities with this guy. I rolled down my window to ask where he was going, and he was going to Rosebud, same as me. He hopped in, holding a bag of ice to his face; his nose and mouth were bleeding. I pulled a few Subway napkins from the compartment in the armrest.

"What happened?"

"I got beat up for no reason."

He was in tears off and on for much of the ride. He was beat up by four men, he says, simply because he's part Diné (Navajo) and is only on the reservation because his mother, who is Lakota, lives here. He shared how scared he was as he was getting beat up, and all he wanted was to go home. I took him to his home, and he was very eager to introduce me to his mother, and is hoping to come and talk to me some time. "I need guidance in my life."

The hospital is quiet and nearly deserted. I visit my parishioner, and her face lights up when I crinkle the wrapper of the Milky Way bar. She first receives communion and then we talk for a while, longer than I anticipated; she's a faithful woman, and has been a Godsend for me: she has a long memory of how things were, and is not afraid to tell me how things should be.

On my way home I do what I can to console a dear friend who is deeply troubled by everything in the news about the Church lately. I get home and start a load of laundry; tomorrow I drive to Milwaukee for a few days visiting friends and recharging my batteries a bit after a heck of a couple of weeks. In a little bit, once the engine has cooled and the oil has settled, I need to check the oil; the light for that popped on as I was pulling into town.

There are stories--true stories--of bad priests out there, and it's horrific, wounding, and all around hellish. But I share the story of my day to remind all of us that most priests are out there on the front lines fighting the little battles, running out into No Man's Land to bring water to a thirsting member of the Body of Christ, to bandage up wounds as best we can, and to try and bring Christ to the people who need Him. You aren't going to hear about us in the news, but we don't do what we do for the world's attention: we do it because we love Him, and because we love you. Pray for us!
