Genesis 2:18-24; Hebrews 2:9-11;
Mark 10:2-16

Today we begin using the Book of Hebrews for our second reading. We shall continue using this book until the end of the Church Year. The general theme of Hebrews is the superiority of Jesus Christ and the new covenant over the old way.

Scholars debate the origin and background of the book. Some think it is an apologetic of Christians against forces in the Church who wanted to return to many Jewish practices. Others think that it was a response of dispersed Christians to Jews in Jerusalem who wanted help during the Jewish-Roman War of 69-70 A.D.

According to this theory, Jews in Jerusalem would be pleading for Christians to remember with nostalgia the temple, the liturgy, the covenant, and to return to help save Jerusalem. The answer (in this theory) would be that Christians no longer needed these things, for they had a new and better way. Remember that the second reading rarely fits the theme of the first reading and Gospel.

The real theme of today's Mass is the sanctity of marriage. Man and woman are made for each other. The "institution" of marriage was created by God from the beginning; he intends that marriage be a blessing which lasts until death.

(The first reading may seem a bit chauvinistic to us. But remember that woman was considered as chattel property by many ancient cultures.) Not so in Judaism! Woman had the same nature as man. "Rib" probably is not a good translation. The Hebrew word here probably comes from the Ugaritic language word and means "life." Woman and man have the same LIFE.

Jesus does not mince words in the Gospel. He says that whoever divorces and remarries commits adultery. This is a negative way of saying that couples need to solve their problems and grow in love so that there is never any thought of divorce. Pray today that all married couples will grow together in understanding, patience, and mature love.

Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 6, 2024

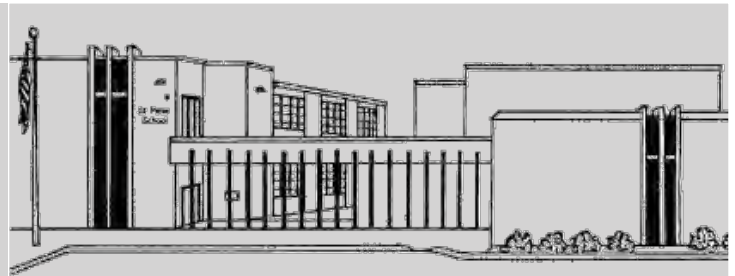
Dear Parishioners,

On this first weekend of October, we find the Church celebrating the 27th Sunday in Ordinary time. One of the many reasons for living in the Midwest is this time of the year, when we begin to experience the changes of nature. Autumn is that time of the year when we see first hand the beauty of God's creation.

As I was thinking about our Scripture readings for this weekend, I want to concentrate my attention on the second part of our Gospel for today. It says that "people were bringing children to Jesus that He might touch them, but the disciples rebuked these children. When Jesus saw this He became indignant and said to them, 'let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these.' Then He embraced the children and blessed them, placing His hands on them." This is such a beautiful Scripture passage as it reflects the fundamental challenge to parents. First, it shows Jesus' concern for children. In fact, it sort of portrays Jesus as that favorite uncle who loves to have children near Him for play and for teaching. Jesus seems to be open to them, showing His care and affection for them. And when the disciples rebuke the kids as if Jesus did not care, that's when we find Jesus correcting them and giving a challenge to all parents, as He states, "do not prevent them from coming to Him, for the kingdom of Heaven belongs to such as these." And so to our parents, you are challenged to bring the children to Jesus especially each and every Sunday. This is the time that we meet Jesus sacramentally in the Eucharist, where He touches us with His very Body and Blood, and blesses us as He sends us forth having been in His presence. As an encouragement of bringing the little ones to Jesus, we have been challenging our parents to take this role seriously. We have even asked them to sign cards indicating that they have brought their little children to Jesus on Sundays. The incentive was to assist them with the tuition in our grade school. Should we have to do that, no, but we will take parents where they are and try to encourage them to be present with their children at the Eucharist. Most of our parents are taking our invitation seriously. But there are a few who are trying to, as people say, beat the system. So we find some parents, instead of bringing the children to Mass, dropping off the cards signed and then leaving. Others are having complicit in their scheme, grandparents who willingly drop these cards in the collection without seeing their grandkids at Mass. This is really unfortunate as it defeats what we are trying to do. I really feel sorry for them as they miss the point of what Jesus was saying, "let the children come to me and do not prevent them." I'm not stupid and I see so much. It is a sad commentary that parents, instead of being challenged by Jesus' words to them about bringing their children, instead try their best to beat the system in an attempt not to fulfill their responsibility as a parent.

During the month of October, our ushers will once again be taking the October count at all the Masses. Hopefully this will help us realize that our encouragement of our parents to bring their young ones to Mass will help us improve our attendance. We are a people of the Eucharist and it is in and through the Eucharist that we encounter Jesus' body, soul, and divinity and are nourished and strengthened by His presence sacramentally.

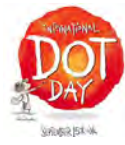


