Deuteronomy 6:2-6; Hebrews 7:23-28;
Mark 12:28B-34

Love of God is the basis of the Hebrew or Jewish faith, just as it is the basis of our Christian faith. Our first reading today quotes the oldest known prayer; this prayer is in every synagogue service; it is a part of Jewish daily prayer. It is called the “Shema” (pronounced “Shmah”).

The prayer reads: “Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is Lord alone. Therefore you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength.” (Our third graders know that this comes from Deuteronomy 6:5 – do you???)

When Jesus is asked about the greatest commandment of the Torah, he quotes this. But he adds that the second greatest commandment is Leviticus 19:18: “You shall love your neighbor as yourself.” He teaches that all of the Torah is summed up in these two commands. We can’t love God unless we care for our neighbor’s needs; we can’t truly love our neighbor unless we first love God.

Conservatives think that they can have great religious faith while letting the needy take care of themselves. Liberals think that the essence of real faith is social justice and doing good to others, while they often forget to honor God himself. True faith must be found in works; works must be grounded in faith.

“Love” is not an emotion. It means to cherish above others; to put another’s needs above one’s own; to care for others even when it costs us. Love of God means keeping his commandments.

Love of neighbor means kindness, humility, respect, care, patience, forgiveness, reconciliation. Love of neighbor means that we seek what is best for him – even when it may seem to cause pain at the time. To do what is right and best is the only true love. Let us seek to grow daily in true love of God and of neighbor.

Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time, November 3, 2024

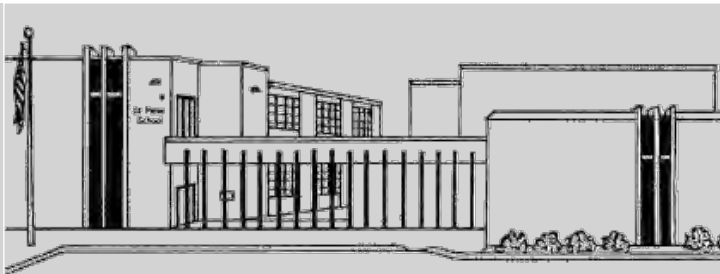
Dear Parishioners,

Well, the month of October has come and gone and now we begin the new month of November. This weekend then we celebrate the 31st Sunday in our Ordinary time. This weekend is also the weekend that we turn our clocks back, and I hope that all of us do this semi-annual chore or we might find ourselves an hour early for our activities for the day. As we celebrate this month of November, the Church invites us to recall that tradition of our faith called the Communion of Saints. In that tradition we remember that we are called by God to live as His saints, with the hope that someday that sainthood will be fulfilled with life with our God forever in heaven. In that tradition of the “Communion of Saints,” we remember all those who have gone before us and are called the Church triumphant, those people who have died and have been canonized (recognized) or not but living with God forever in heaven. We celebrate the Church triumphant on November 1, the Solemnity of All Saints. In 2000 I had the privilege of shaking the hand of one of them, namely Pope John Paul II. But through the years of my life, I am confident that I have known many of these non-canonized people who are with God in heaven. Some day we hope and pray that Fr. Augustine Tolton will join this recognized group. Besides the Church triumphant, this month also challenges us to be the Church militant, those still struggling in life to live close to our Lord. It’s amazing how God’s grace changes us from sinners to saints but often through a life long struggle. But the Church militant gives all of us a sense of hope that we have time to struggle with the temptations of life to draw closer to our Lord in and through His Word and Sacraments. Our category of Church militant began at our baptisms. Finally, the last of the Communion of Saints is the Church suffering, those who have completed their lives here on earth and are being made ready for the ultimate happiness of heaven. We celebrate the Church militant on November 2, the Feast of All Souls. During the month of November the Church encourages us to pray for the dead. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.

During the month of November the Church challenges us to remember that death is a part of life. It’s part of the reality of life and each of us has experienced it in so many differing ways. The uncertainty of this reality often causes an uneasiness in our lives as we often fear the unknown. But the Church always reminds us that one of the cardinal virtues of life is the virtue of hope. And that hope is a reality for which we long and live, namely, life forever with our God. Let each of us be filled with that grace of hope.

It is also during the month of November as we remember those who have died, that we are also encouraged to contribute to the places of the dead, namely our Catholic cemeteries here in Quincy. We are fortunate to have three beautiful resting places for our deceased, Calvary, St. Boniface, and St. Peter Cemeteries. As a member of the Board of these cemeteries, we are always challenged to make our cemeteries places of beauty and attractiveness. Often times the money for long term care doesn’t cover additional costs like driveways, tree replacements, and new additions to the cemetery itself. So I ask you to use your special cemetery envelopes to help us improve and advance our cemeteries. Thank you!

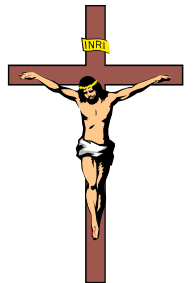
