

Pastor's Letter

November 3, 2024—31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Church Family,

Some people think that love is just a feeling that comes over us, something we just "fall into," not something to which we need to give much thought or effort. But Jesus reminds us in our Gospel reading for today that real love is not as simple or as easy as that. In responding to a question about which is the first of all the commandments, Jesus responds with a quote from the book of Deuteronomy in the Old Testament, "The first is this: Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength." That sounds like quite a workout to me!

Anyone who has been married for more than twenty minutes knows that maintaining a loving relationship takes real effort. The investment of time and energy to foster good communication, work through conflict, negotiate differences, and give and receive forgiveness is substantial. It is also the most rewarding thing that human beings do. We are social animals (even us introverts!) and we are made for communion with God and with our fellow human beings. We experience communion with God when we obey his revealed will and receive the grace of the sacraments which he has established as the channels by which his power and love flow into us. This communion with God connects us to the source of our being and grounds us in love. Connection with God feeds our souls and strengthens us so that we can love others more fully. That's why Jesus' answer to the question of which is the most important commandment doesn't end with loving God with everything we've got, but also includes loving our neighbors as ourselves. The two are linked together. We are created by God, who is love, so that we can be extensions of his love in the world. Loving my neighbor as myself means that I recognize our common origin in God, that we all have the same needs, rights, and responsibilities, and if one of us is hurting or in need, we all suffer.

Building communion doesn't just happen. It takes intentional effort and attention on our part. May God help us to stay close to him in prayer, study, and an active sacramental life so that we can show our love for him in acts of love and service to our neighbors.

Evangelization Team



- Sing Christmas Carols/Make Christmas Cards for Shut-ins/People in Nursing Homes



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Charles Borromeo

Saint Charles Borromeo's feast day is November 4. He believed in living every aspect of his life for the greater glory of God. St. Charles (1538-1584) was the son of a count and sister of Pope Pius IV. Raised in luxury and prestige, he gave up his title and honors to become a priest, and later was named archbishop. Much of his life was spent dealing with disasters such as the plague and widespread famine. At one time, he was feeding 3,000 people a day!

St. Charles oversaw the creation of the catechism, missal and breviary called for by the Council of Trent. His work led to the creation of the prototype for our religious education programs.



Sunday, November 3 Readings - FOR YOUTH!

Mark 12: 28-34

In today's Gospel reading, one of the scribes asked Jesus what was the most important commandment of God. Jesus told him that the most important rule was to love God with everything – our heart, our soul, our mind, and all our strength. The next most important rule is to love others as much as we love ourselves. God made us to love Him. We will never be really happy unless we do. But if we keep God first in our lives, then everything else will happen the way God wants it to. If we love God first, then we can love others the way God asks.

What can you do to keep God first in your life? How about saying a prayer as soon as you wake up in the morning, and last thing before you go to bed at night?


