Deer season is coming quickly, and CFCAC needs donated deer and funds to process those deer. Deer meat is a great benefit to our Food Pantry by providing our clients with nutritious meat and stretching our Food Pantry funds. Our request is for you to inform your members, especially those who are hunters, to consider donating a harvested deer to the Center. **CFCAC will pay** for the processing costs at any of three locations:

- Golden Locker will only take bow-killed deer 217-696-4456 706 Wendell Street, Golden
- Dawning Day Processing (part of Homestyle Foods) will take all deer 217-322-7519 – 3024 N 1200th Ave., Clayton
- One Stop Butcher Shop (previously Bowen Locker) will take all deer 309-333-7736 – 115 East 5th Street, Bowen

Please ask the hunters to tell the location to designate it for CFCAC. If someone is not a hunter, a donation of funds to our CFCAC Food Pantry would help defray these processing fees. If a monetary donation is given, please write in the memo line "deer processing."
