1 Kings 17:10-16; Hebrews 9:24-28;
Mark 12:38-44

You can't run a parish on copper coins of destitute widows. But if everyone had the spirit of generous sacrifice shown by the widow in today's Gospel, no parish would ever have financial problems.

The Old Testament made the tithe ("ten percent") the rigid norm and ideal for giving. That is not good New Testament theology. Jesus tells us that those who have more must give more – not merely in quantity, but in percentage! Stewardship is to recognize God as the giver of all gifts, and to seek to thank him by returning to him the first and best.

Today's first reading tells of a widow nine centuries before Christ. She was not of the Chosen People; she was a gentile or pagan. She was destitute and about to die; yet she gave from her want to Elijah ... and was richly rewarded.

In the Gospel, Jesus observes a lot of "comfortable" people giving sizable donations to the Temple; he then sees a poor widow who gives two copper coins – all that she had to live on. He says that she did more than all the rest.

Unless we sacrifice, we don't really practice much stewardship. If we give out of our surplus (whether it is time, talent, or treasure), it requires little effort and little faith. Great faith is required to give from a person's want.

Test your faith: In planning your budget, do you decide first what you will give to the Church, or does that come after everything else? If it comes afterwards, how do you explain this to the Lord?

Listen to the Lord. He may be calling you to a higher state of holiness. He may be calling on you to take a leap of faith, to sacrifice. Whether poor, middle class, or wealthy, he calls you to give the first and best of your time, talent and treasure. He calls you to sacrifice. If you respond to his call, he will not be outdone in generosity.

Dear Parishioners,

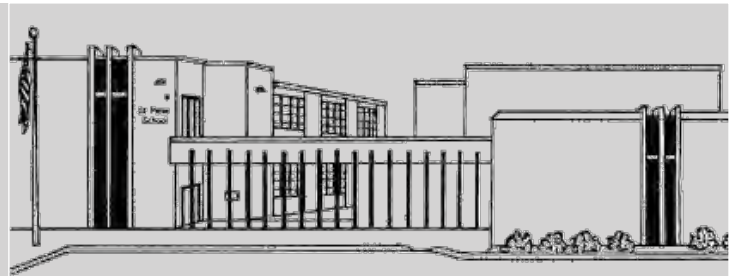
We gather as a parish family to celebrate the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary time. As the numbers of this ordinary time continue to increase, it is a clear indicator that this season is coming to a close. In fact there are only two weekends remaining in ordinary time before we begin the new season of Advent. Not wanting to alarm anyone, but our Advent season prepares us to anticipate and celebrate the Solemnity of Christmas. Wow! Not many of us have been thinking of that season.

Today is Commitment Sunday. Today is the day! Every parish household is asked to bring their completed Commitment Card to Mass or complete a card online at our parish website, www.cospq.org. We are striving to become the Stewardship Parish that God intends us to be—intentionally committed to prayer, parish ministry, and the sharing of our financial gifts. Each parishioner has a unique and vital part to play and is needed in this mission. What is our part this year? Put it in writing and turn in your Commitment Card today!

Our gospel for this weekend fits in quite well with our Commitment Sunday. This gospel from St. Mark is the story of a poor widow. As the gospel tells us, Jesus sits down and is observing how the crowd was sharing their financial gifts in the treasury. As it states, “many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow also came and put in two small coins worth a few cents. Calling His disciples to Himself, He said to them, ‘Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasure. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood.’” The poor widow becomes an example of a person who reflected stewardship in her life. Even the little that she had, she was willing to share because she saw that whatever she had was a gift from God. This is the true spirit of stewardship. The gifts that God has blessed us, the gifts of our time, are to be shared with Him through prayer and service. The gifts of talents, those gifts given to each of us are to be used again in service to God, and His Church. And finally, the gifts of treasures, those gifts that we have because of God’s gifts of time and talents, are to be used to assist, and help in the growth of God’s kingdom. One of the more remarkable features of this parish family is the embrace of stewardship as a way of life for all of us. I am so proud of this parish family for being open to this stewardship because through it we have become a parish that is thankful and full of gratitude, thus a people of faith, hope, and love. May God bless each of you as you pray about your commitment again this year and how each of you can respond to the call of stewardship for this new year. May each of you reflect the attitude of the poor widow in our gospel as we too give from our poverty and not just from our surplus.

This Sunday, November 10, you are invited to join us for Eucharistic Adoration from 5:45-7:00 p.m. in the Church. On this commitment Sunday, it gives us an opportunity to share our gift of time with our Lord in prayer as we reflect upon what our Lord has given to us in and through the Eucharist. Come and join us as a family or as individuals.

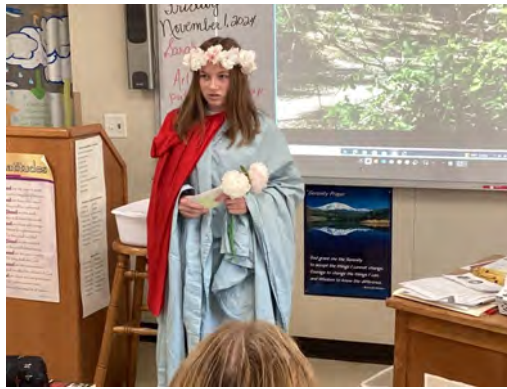
