

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

Why is it that there has always been such keen interest in the 'end-times'... the apocalypse... the 'end of the world'? Television preachers make a living off of it. The (anti-Catholic) Left Behind series features 16 books having sold a total of 80 million copies. A few years ago, we heard about the Mayan "prophecy" for destruction of the world on December 21, 2012... remember that? Others are trying to read the signs of the times to position themselves for meltdown due to the 'fiscal cliff' that stands before us. I think part of the interest is the simple desire to control our world and destinies, but there's more to it than that. We want to



know how it all ends. Will justice be served to the deserving? Will we end up on the "right side" of things when all is said and done? Will the suffering and sacrifice and tribulation turn out to be 'worth it' in the end?

A central message from scripture is that the old world will pass away and that a new one will be 'unveiled' (from where we get the word "Revelation"). All we know of it will pass away—perhaps very dramatically—but alert, 'awake' faith in Jesus as Lord will be the sign of the new order that will replace it. At Mass we participate in nothing less than the new and everlasting covenant which is sealed in the Blood of Christ. In doing so, we reveal his presence and the eminent truth of his final coming by our lives as faithful followers of the Lamb.



On Sunday, December 1, St. Anthony of Padua Church celebrates the 40th anniversary of the dedication of our parish church. The Church was consecrated by Bishop Daniel Ryan at a Mass on December 1, 1984, and has been the spiritual home of many who have passed through the doors week by week and day by day. The Church encourages us to celebrate the anniversary of the dedication of a church building with ample solemnity and remembrance of the importance of the church building as the house of God and the refuge of God's holy people. Whether the church of the pope, a grand cathedral, or a very practical parish church at the edge of the world, each church building dedicated to the worship of God is a physical, tangible anticipation of the Kingdom of God and the work of the people to worship God in spirit and in truth. We have much to be thankful for in God's providence and in the sacrifices and efforts made by those who have gone before us to provide our church building all these years later.

While we will run our regular Mass schedule that weekend, Bishop Paprocki will join us for Mass at 10:30 a.m. on Sunday, December 1 for this important celebration. There will be a small reception afterwards.
