Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King

NOVEMBER 24, 2024

Daniel 7:13-14: Revelation 1:5-8: John 18:33b-37

What difference does Jesus Christ make in your life? When you are at work or at play, does your faith in him make you any different from others? When you are relaxing with friends, or when you are enjoying recreation, are you any different because you know **Christ Jesus?**

Jesus Christ should be the meaning of every dimension of our lives. We don't always need to voice this; it's often better that we don't. But people should see in our lives the reflection of Jesus Christ. They should see that we live entirely for him, and that he is the reason for everything we do.

The Feast of Christ the King was instituted in 1925 (in the "Roaring Twenties") when civic and social life was divorced entirely from religion. It was the time of the rise of Totalitarian dictatorships. Among religious people, it was a time of sentimentality without substance.

We claim Christ as our King: All laws of nations must be subject to his moral reign. We claim Christ as our King: We cannot be content with mere sentimentality in our private religion; we are called to profess our faith publicly and

Our first reading is from Daniel. Jesus used the title "Son of Man." Today's reading speaks of one "like a Son of Man" coming on the clouds of heaven and standing between earth and heaven.

Our second reading describes Jesus Christ as the ruler of all the kings of the earth. The Gospel is ironic: Jesus has been beaten; yet he proclaims that he is King. His kingship is dedicated to proclaiming truth, justice, righteousness, and mercy. He will die for this, but death cannot be victorious. He will always triumph. Let us renew our loyalty to Christ our King in every dimension of our lives.

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe Solemnity, November 24, 2024 Dear Parishioners,

With the celebration this weekend of the Solemnity of Christ the King, we bring our liturgical calendar to a close. Our second reading from the Book of Revelation seems to describe this Solemnity as it beautifully states "Behold, He is coming amid the clouds, and every eye will see Him, even those who pierced Him. All the peoples of the earth will lament Him. Yes. Amen. I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, "the one who is and who was, and who is to come, the almighty." Simply put, this Jesus will come again in glory, and creation as we know it will come to an end. This Jesus who entered our world as the Son of God, is beautifully described as the alpha and the omega, meaning the beginning of and the end of all time. How appropriate then on this Solemnity of Christ the King that we bring our liturgical calendar to a close and then begin another year of grace with Christ always the center of all time and space.


Perhaps the words of our Nicene Creed describe this Solemnity as we proclaim each and every Sunday "He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and His kingdom will have no end." Our time here on earth is fragile and limited, as each of us realize more and more that this place we call home is only temporary. That our eyes must be fixed upon Christ and always realize that we live for Him and will hopefully share in His eternal life with Him. In the meantime, we are grounded in making His kingdom a reality in life. This kingdom is different from any other kingdom because this kingdom is not of this world. In our Preface for our Eucharist today, we pray that Jesus "might present to the immensity of God's majesty an eternal and universal kingdom, a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace." There is no other kingdom on earth than the one that Jesus our King has established and helps grow in grace in each of our hearts. "Thy Kingdom come!"

This Thursday, November 28, is Thanksgiving Day. Because we accommodate the YMCA with their Turkey Run, our Mass will be at 9:30 that day. Since we are striving to be a stewardship parish, gathering to give God thanks for all His blessings is something that is fundamental to us. We have so much for which we need to thank our God and our celebration of this holiday is one way that we reflect that attitude of thankfulness. As pastor, I am forever grateful for this parish family and I thank God for each of you. Also, on behalf of Fr. Paul and myself, and the entire school/parish staff, I wish all of you a very Happy Thanksgiving.

As a special Advent gift, there will be books available in the narthex for our parishioners to use during the new season of Advent. The book is entitled An Introduction to Prayer by Bishop Robert Barron. Please take one per family and I encourage you to use it during this Advent season, helping you to prepare for the coming of Christ in history, in Sacraments, and at the end of time. Haiti Sister Parish Update

Three weeks ago Fr. Michel visited Quincy to update Fr. Leo and the Sister Parish Committee on Haiti and his three parishes. Recently a new prime minister took office. Although a Kenyan-led force is there to address gang activity, lawless mobs continue to roam the country. This week a Spirit airline was shot at as it attempted to land in Port au Prince. As a result, no planes will fly to that city through the middle of December. Fortunately, when Fr. Michel flies it is from either Cap Haitian or the Dominican Republic.

While the Haitian people may feel helpless, Father says they are not hopeless. Their Catholic faith gives them hope, as does the spiritual and financial support from St. Peter Parish. After nine years as sister parishes, our relationship remains strong. This week Father sent a video showing his parishioners and him celebrating the feast day of St. Leo the Great in Garoty. Father continues to purchase food for his parishioners with the money we send on a quarterly basis.

This past summer Father took seventy-six children for an eight-day camp. During that time they received three meals a day (a rarity for most), learned about the bible and enjoyed a variety of games and physical activities.

School resumed October 1. Father brought pictures of and letters from current students for their St. Peter Parish sponsors to review.

Fr. Michel discussed possible upcoming goals with Fr. Leo and the committee. His first goal is to acquire a new truck. The roads throughout Haiti are riddled with potholes, especially to his two mission churches in the mountains, causing significant wear and tear to his only transportation. Repair parts are difficult to obtain, if not impossible. A second goal is to increase the number of education scholarships we provide for students. The final goal is to have iron bars installed on the church windows as a much-needed security measure.

Before Father Michel departed Quincy, he reiterated his profound appreciation to St. Peter parishioners for their continued prayers and financial support.






