

Pastor's Letter

November 24, 2024—Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Dear Church Family,

Today the church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. In our first reading from the book of the prophet Daniel we have an image of what this title means for the big picture. "When he reached the Ancient One and was presented before him, the one like a Son of man received dominion, glory, and kingship; all peoples, nations, and languages serve him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not be taken away, his kingship shall not be destroyed." Jesus has proven his lordship by conquering even death itself and one day all creation will acknowledge him.

But acknowledging his authority is not enough to enable one to participate in the joy and peace of his kingdom. Remember, even the demons knew who he was. Bare facts by themselves will not save us. How then can we share eternal life with Christ? By claiming him as not only THE king of the universe, but as MY king and savior.

We get a picture of what that looks like in our Gospel reading where the governor, Pontius Pilate, is questioning Jesus. "Pilate said to Jesus, 'Are you the King of the Jews?' Jesus answered, "Do you say this on your own or have others told you about me?" Pilate says in response, "I am not a Jew, am I." By saying that he shows that he is outside of the family of believers. He has not invested any of himself in whether or not Jesus really is a king. He is after the "truth", but it is not a truth that impacts him personally. He is above it all. Just the facts, please. That approach to Jesus has no power to save. He is just trying to figure out if Jesus is a threat to the authority of the Roman government, not if he might be someone who could help him find the answers to his questions about the meaning of his life.

Today, as we proclaim that Jesus is Lord and King of the Universe, what are we saying? Are we only repeating words that we have heard about Jesus? Have those words really sunken into our hearts? Do they have an impact on the way we live our lives? Are they a true expression of faith and trust in Christ? Is he my hope and salvation? To experience fullness of life in Jesus Christ I must claim him, not only as THE Lord, but MY Lord; the ruler, not just of the universe in general, but of my life.




Food Pantry Donations




Abraham: Father of Faith

Confirmation Saint Name

Has your child who is receiving the sacrament of Confirmation this year chosen his/her saint name yet? If not, make sure you are taking the time to talk to him/her about it!

Why do we choose a saint name for Confirmation? Because the one to be Confirmed will be sent out "to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross" (CCC 1309), the idea of choosing a Confirmation name is to choose the name of a saint who can help fulfill this mission. Sometimes a saint is chosen because of his or her patronage, because of the name itself, because of a common personality, or because of his or her story. Sometimes, though, it also seems a saint, as it were, chooses us. Whatever the case, choosing the name of saint is a way of placing oneself under the patronage of this particular friend of God, of seeking to imitate this person who imitated Christ, and of seeking the prayers and guidance of this saint (cf. 1 Corinthians 11:1).


