





O Come, O Come, Emmanuel! Welcome to Advent! The term "advent" means "arrival" or "coming", referring, of course, to the arrival of our Lord. The Church proclaims that there are three "arrivals" to watch for: in "history, mystery, and in glory". Christ's coming "in history" refers to his Nativity, as the all creation sings a new song of praise and glory to the Lord who reveals the love of the Father. The second coming "in mystery" refers to the institution and the ongoing celebration of the Eucharist, which is the "making present again" the mystery of Calvary. The cross is the ultimate sign of Divine Love, and the Eucharist is the fulfilment of the promise that that Divine Love will be visible to all people of all times, not as a merely representational presence (this "stands for my body", this

representational presence (this "stands for my body", this "represents my blood") but as a "Real Presence" (this "*is* my Body", this "*is* my Blood"). We enter into the covenant with the same, immediate 'presence' of those who stood under the cross being sprinkled by the water (Baptism) and blood (Eucharist) flowing from his side. Finally, we look to his final coming, which itself will be of two parts. The first will be when we close our eyes on this world and open them into eternity... this is the particular judgment, when we face our Lord with the burden of our sins and implore his mercy. The final coming will be at the general judgment when all the living and dead will be collected and those destined for heaven will hear the words "come, good and faithful servants," and the others will be sent to their damnation.

We prepare well for each of these arrivals. A good advent helps us to prepare well for Christmas, realizing and living the "meaning of the season". Having an advent spirituality helps us to see ourselves as pilgrim people—heading to a destination, a new home—being fed by the Eucharist. Having an advent spirituality keeps before us the expectation of that final coming that we face at the end of our lives and at the end of the world. We recognize that we are the "captive Israel" that we implore the Lord to "ransom". Come Emmanuel, shine your light on the people who long to see your face!



Monday, December 9 is held as a **Holy Day of Obligation** for the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Masses will be on (Monday only), 7:30 a.m. at St. Anthony, 9:00 a.m. at St. Dominic, and 6:30 p.m. at St. Anthony.

Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, December 12-13-14 will be our Advent Mission. We welcome Sr. Clementia Toalson, FSGM who will be giving a series of Advent-themed talks entitled "They That Hope". Keep an eye out for more details on the times and places for these events..

New Rosary Art At St. Dominic School



The Annunciation Fra Angelico - Italy, c. 1440-45 Artistic Period: Early Renaissance

St. Gabriel the Archangel brings a request from God the Father, that the Virgin Mary might consent to become who He has created her to be, the Theotokos, Mother of God. Later works of this incredible moment in history often miss a very important truth that Fra Angelico beautifully portrays here in his depiction of the Annunciation, seen in the deferential kneeling posture of St. Gabriel before the Blessed Virgin. Fra Angelico represents the moment this way because St. Gabriel is not the spiritual authority between the two persons in the scene. That honor belongs to the Blessed Mother, Queen of Heaven and Earth. Created by God to be the mother of His Son, as mother of the King of the Universe she also acquires the title and authority of Queen Mother. As such, St. Gabriel, one of the seven angels that stand before the face of God, is still lower in rank than the one to whom he delivers the invitation that inaugurates the salvation of the world.



At St. Dominic School, we share the Catholic tradition about St. Dominic who had a vision of Mary in 1214. Mary is said to have presented him with the rosary, both the beads and the prayers to be prayed. St. Dominic had a special devotion to Mary and the rosary, which he promoted wherever he traveled to preach. This year, we received a grant to enhance our school culture by purchasing and displaying beautiful replications of famous art for each of the Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious, and Luminous Mysteries. To date, we have displayed the artwork and an informational plaque for each of the Joyful and Luminous Mysteries. We plan to complete the display in January. Please come visit the school to enjoy the beautiful display and pray the rosary, which was made possible by a generous Tracy Family Foundation grant.
