- CHAPLAIN'S REFLECTION

I remember the chilling feeling of standing on the spot in Sarajevo, Bosnia where, on June 28, 1924, Bosnian Serb Gavrilo Princep assassinated Archduke Franz Ferdinand of Austria and his wife. This proved to be the spark that kindled one of the most terrible conflicts in all human history, World War I.

That war grew to be a global conflict between two coalitions: the Allies and the Central Powers. The parties fought in unrelenting brutal trench warfare, using deadly machine guns, tanks, suicidal charges and poisonous gas. There were some 40 million casualties, 20 million killed and 23 million maimed and wounded. Parts of the battlefields are even today dangerous from unexploded ordinance.

Perhaps it seems inappropriate to mention this event in the month we celebrate the birth of the Savior but something of a miracle happened during that war. This was highlighted by Stanley Weintraub in his book, *Silent Night*:

On Christmas Eve, men on both sides laid down their arms and joined in a spontaneous celebration. Despite orders to continue shooting, the unofficial truce spread across the front lines. Even the participants found what they were doing, incredible: Germans placed candlelit Christmas trees on trench parapets, warring soldiers sang carols, and men on opposing sides shared food parcels from home. They climbed the trenches to meet in "No Man's Land" where they buried the dead, exchanged gifts, ate and drank together, and even played soccer.^{*}

For a moment amid the insanity of the war men were moved by the spirit of the season, to turn from the violence, to each other as fellow humans and to celebrate the season. The spirit of Jesus visited the battlefields, and peace prevailed.

As we enter the month of Christmas we pray that something of that miracle happens again, as people around the world turn their hearts to Bethlehem





and the Infant who was born there. Let us lift our hearts for a moment to the Lord.

If we could only carry that spirit with us throughout the year!

Perhaps we can!


