DECEMBER 15, 2024

Zephaniah 3:14-18a; Philippians 4:4-7; Luke 3:10-18

Today is called "Gaudete Sunday." "Gaudete" is the Latin word for "Rejoice!" It is the first word of the Entrance Antiphon.

Our first reading is from Zephaniah, a contemporary of Jeremiah. Israel had been destroyed in 721 B.C.; only Judah remained, but Judah and Jerusalem were thoroughly corrupt.

Zephaniah warns of doom unless people repent. Most of the book of Zephaniah is depressing with its threats of "fire and brimstone." But the last part of the book from which today's first reading is taken, is joyful. Zephaniah sees a time when God will restore. We must rejoice because the Lord is in our midst.

The second reading was written by Paul when he was in jail at Ephesus. He suffered miserably, and most of his "friends" abandoned him. The people of Philippi helped him, however, and he wrote this friendly letter to them to thank them. He tells them (and us) to rejoice in the Lord always even when we have problems. For the Lord is with us and will see us through.

John the Baptist, like Zephaniah and Jeremiah and the prophets of old, was fiery in his condemnation of sin and evil. But his message is simple: Do good and avoid evil. If you are a businessman, be a person of integrity and honesty. If you are a laborer, give a full day's work for your wages. If you are a policeman, don't bully anyone.

In other words be sincere, humble, and honest in your treatment of everyone. The world might not be perfect if we put this into effect. But it would surely be more of a place of peace and joy!

Third Sunday of Advent, December 15, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

On this Third Sunday of Advent, the Church traditionally has called our celebration "Gaudete Sunday." The word "Gaudete" is Latin for "rejoice." On this particular Sunday we find the words of St. Paul in his letter to the Philippians being central to our celebration as it says in our entrance antiphon, "*Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say, rejoice. Indeed the Lord is near.*" The cause of our being filled with joy, is that the Word of God enters into human history, takes upon Himself our human nature, and saves us from our own sins. Without this salvation, we would be living lives separate from our God and what God intended for us. Through His death and resurrection, we have found favor once again with our God and have been reconciled once again. And that is truly cause for our rejoicing. As we celebrate the anticipation of this Christmas mystery, there truly is cause for us being filled with joy. And so today, "*rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say rejoice. The Lord is near.*"


Very much a part of our Advent practice is to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) before our Christmas time. We will be having a city wide Reconciliation Service on Sunday, December 22, at 3:00 p.m. here at St. Peter Church. A number of priests from the area will be with us for individual confessions. This will be the last time before Christmas so I encourage you to celebrate the Lord's forgiveness that particular day. Again, save Sunday, December 22 to celebrate the reconciliation of the Lord in this sacrament of forgiveness.

This next Thursday and Friday, December 19-20, our students will be presenting their annual program for parents and grandparents. The program for our parents will be on Thursday afternoon, beginning at 1:30 p.m. Then on Friday, December 20, our grandparents are invited to Mass at 8:30 a.m. in the Church with a program for them at 10:30 a.m. in the school gym. Then our students will dismiss for Christmas vacation at 11:30 a.m. that Friday.

Also, I want to invite you to the annual Christmas concert by the QND chorus to be held this Monday, December 16, at 6:30 p.m. in the Church. This annual event shares with us the very talented group of young people from QND who share their musical talents with us, preparing us for our Christmas celebration.

As we look ahead, I want to post our Christmas Mass schedule to help you prepare for our celebration. Our Christmas eve celebration begins with a Mass at 4:00 p.m. For those who have attended this Mass in the past, this Mass is very crowded, sometimes standing room only. Our next two Masses which I encourage you to attend will be at 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. Then on Christmas day we will have two Masses, an 8:00 a.m. and a 10:00 a.m. Mass. Some people have questioned why we don't have a Midnight Mass on Christmas. When I first got here a number of years ago, we tried the Midnight Mass but our attendance was so low that it was not worth keeping that Mass. Because the 4:00 p.m. Mass is so crowded, I encourage our parishioners to try another time be it later on Christmas eve or perhaps on Christmas morning. What a joy to see all of you present as we celebrate this great Solemnity of Christmas.

The Catholic Children's Home celebrated their 145 anniversary this year. Although times have changed, their mission to serve as a 'beacon of hope' for children in need has not. The Catholic Children's Home (CCH) has been a safe harbor and a place to call home for thousands of children over the years.

CCH continues their mission by meeting the emotional, social, academic and basic material needs of all the children sent for residential care or special education services. This includes an innovative program designed to serve the needs of children with severe autistic challenges. "Children are a gift from the Lord; they are a reward from him." They are some of the most vulnerable in our society.
