
"For behold, when the voice of your greeting came to my ears, the babe in my womb leaped for joy." (Luke 1:44)

15 Scriptures about the Birth of Jesus Christ

Christmas is more than just a season for giving gifts, hanging festive decorations, and enjoying delicious meals. It's also an opportunity to express gratitude for the life of Jesus Christ. These verses from the Bible preach of Jesus's birth and His love for human kind.

Christmas Verses from the Bible

- **1.) Matthew 1:23** Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us.
- 2.) Matthew 2:1-2 Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem, saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? For we have seen his star in the east, and have come to worship him.
- **3.) Matthew 2: 9-10** When they had heard the king, they departed, and, lo, the star, which they saw in the east, went before them, until it came and stood over where the young child was. When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceeding great joy.
- **4.) Matthew 2:11** And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child with Mary his mother, and fell down, and worshipped him; and when they had opened their treasurers, they presented unto him gifts; gold, frankincense, and myrrh.
- **5.)** Luke 2:1-5 And it came to pass in those days, that there went our a decree from Caesar Augustus, that all the world should be taxed. And this taxing was first made when Cyrenius was governor of Syria. And all went to be taxed, every one into his own city. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judea, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; (because he was of the house and lineage of David:) To be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child.
- **6.) Luke 2:6-7** And so it was, that, while they were there, the days were accomplished that she should be delivered. And she brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn.
- 7.) Luke 2:8-14 And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And, to, the angel of the Lord cam upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them; and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, Fear not; for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, which is Christ the Lord.
- **8.)** Luke 2:15-16 And it cam to pass, as the angels were gone away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, let us now go even unto Bethlehem, and see this thing which is come to pass, which the Lord hath made known unto us. And they came with haste, and found Mary, and Joseph, and the babe lying in a manager.
