

"For a child is born to us, a son is given us; upon his shoulder dominion rests. They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace...." (from Isaiah 9: 1-6). "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home, for it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins (from Matthew 1: 1-25). In the midst of all for which we ask of God - and Santa! - a reminder of His reason for being born, this and every Christmas day!

The Season of Advent. Our preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ on Christmas Day begins with the Advent season. Our faith enters into the remembrance of awaiting the Lord's *first* coming, as a pattern in which to be awake, alert, and prepared for the comings of Jesus Christ throughout our lives, as well as his *second* coming, at the end of time.

Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses: Note: 3rd year of our rotation among the churches still in effect.

Dear Parishioners of Sacred Heart Church, Dallas City, and Immaculate Conception Church, Hamilton,

On the occasion of our third year in the rotation of our churches, in order for each church to have its turn at the most favored Masses for Christmas and Easter, your "turn" has come to host the treasured Christmas Masses of Christmas Eve (4 p.m. at Dallas City) and Christmas Night (10 p.m. at Hamilton). And despite whatever the inconvenience or loss of personal preference, nevertheless, we offer you our support, and if there's any way possible, our attendance and participation at your Masses.

After July 1, 2025, our Nauvoo, Carthage, and Warsaw churches will have more Christmas and Easter Masses to which to look forward. But this year, your Christmas Mass is the last. It isn't just you, losing your church; it's all of us, losing our churches. And the least we can do is to be in solidarity with you, if our solidarity with you up to this point has meant anything at all. Our hope is that you be a part of our newly aligned parish, with its separate church sites; perhaps...maybe...our understanding this Christmas season might win over a few of you.

We said, "Maybe"!! We understand, and acknowledge, whatever your decisions about your future Catholic Church of worship and membership.

And so....

If, for the sake of family reunion and little children, you don't see us with you, we ask your understanding. We ask the same, if it's just too cold, icy, or snowy outside. And if we come to your Masses, we're OK with contact with Mass through Facebook while in our vehicles. Did it before, during Covid; we can do it again. It's probably as close as we'll get to what the first Christmas must have been like for Mary and Joseph. Sorry, Dallas City, if our coming means you can't even get into the Church! We know you'll make as much room for everyone as you can.

At Dallas City, we understand that Santa is coming but change of location means that we'll only be able to see him outdoors. We've contacted the North Pole; we hear that if we're outside of the church after Mass, we'll catch a glimpse of him, while he's out of his sleigh.

Thank you for the part you played, among all of our five churches, in supporting our all-important Catholic school and other activities. We hope your memories of this Christmas are among the very best, even in the face of your loss.

Thank you, culture: we're very close to Christmas being nothing more than a sports show at half time. Tailgate party, anyone?

Not here, though. We take this opportunity to offer our love, gratitude, and appreciation for all of you, and all you have done to make our churches and school a living sacrifice of praise. Fr. James, Deacon Dan, and Deacon Tony are together with me on this one. And in each and every one of you, our thanksgiving overflows into adoration and worship for the mystery of Christ, born in Bethlehem - born in you - for the salvation of the world. I hope Jesus likes the gifts we got him!! Tell the atheists and agnostics to "put a lid on it" for a while. We know what Christmas is; nobody is going to take Christmas from us. Fr. T.
