## Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

### **DECEMBER 29, 2024**

Sirach 3:2-6,12-14; Colossians 3:12-21; Luke 2:41-52

[There are alternate Biblical texts that may be used for the first and second readings.]

We desperately need fathers who sacrifice themselves for their families. We need fathers and mothers who are firm in discipline with their children, but in whose hearts Christ's peace and love always reigns.

Children will grow to be like their models, their parents: If parents are undisciplined, children will likewise be undisciplined. If parents are indifferent in their faith, we can't expect children to be any different. Today we pray that our families will model themselves after the Holy Family of Joseph, Mary, and Jesus.

Our first reading is from *Sirach*. In older Bibles, this book is called *Ecclesiasticus*, a word which means "Church Book." It was called that because it was the most frequently used Old Testament book in the liturgy. The book is Hebrew poetry, in couplets. Today's reading is plain common sense: Each member of the family needs to respect every other member. Each member of the family must realize his/her distinct role.

The second reading expands on this theme: Husbands are not wives, nor are wives husbands: each has a distinct role. Children are not parents; they must not usurp the parental role; nor can parents abdicate their responsibility to guide their children.

The Gospel scene is the finding of the child Jesus in the Temple. People banded together in great caravans to go up to Jerusalem for pilgrimage feasts. Apparently Joseph and Mary thought that Jesus was with the children in another part of the caravan; they panicked when they discovered that he was not with them.

They returned to Jerusalem to search for him, and found him speaking to the learned men of the Torah. When asked, Jesus says that he had to be in his Father's house. Nevertheless, he who was divine as well as human, went down to Nazareth and was subject to them.

The reflections here on family are many: The concern and solicitude of parents for the child ... The respect of the child for parents ... the humility of the divine child who returns to Nazareth and is subject to those who are inferior to him.

### FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY

The Church gives us many great feasts to celebrate this time of year. Christmas is only four days behind us and today we are celebrating the Holy Family.

The readings today speak to the fourth Commandment. The responsibility to take care of parents and not to grieve them from Sirach. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus lets himself get lost for three days and is obedient from then on. It is all music to a parent's ears. What parent doesn't appreciate well-behaved children? Children who trust that their parents know and want what is best for them. It sounds perfect! Or does it? Does it sound a little too good?

Would we be any less heartbroken at losing a disobedient child? The Holy Family is a divinely wonderful example to us of how much Joseph and Mary loved and cared for Jesus. They also offer a human example of living as a family with the bond of not just love from a child but of paternal and maternal love. Love that fills our home with joy, especially during this season of business and noise.

The Church calls you today to take some quiet time and know divine love with your holy families. Remember, the family that prays together, stays together. There's a great New Year's resolution.

In three days, we will celebrate the Holy Day of The Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. New Year's Day we will have our new resolutions and commitments ready: Exercise more, eat less, study harder, less screen time, and so on. Many are perhaps the same resolutions we began this year with. The Church calls us to seek this time of new resolutions and commitment while we observe the great gift God has given us in Mary, the Holy Mother of God who "pondered" in her heart all the shepherds said of the son she had just given birth to.

The song asks, "Mary did you know?" What Mary was told by Archangel Gabriel was enough for her to say yes to the Lord. Mary did not respond, "if I have time," "if I have money left over," or "if the time fits my schedule."

Mary's response was simple, "I am the handmaid of the Lord, be it done unto me according to your word." Can that be our new resolution, our commitment to have a Holy Year of Hope where we give our yes to the Lord? "Yes Lord, with your grace I will live out my vocation to be a disciple with intention and purpose with faith and hope in your promise of eternal life. Will we follow the precepts of the Church Christ gave us including observing this and all the days of obligation with our attendance and participation at mass? How the Father rejoices to hear our yes!

Fr. Arisman, Fr. Ken, and I thank all of you for your generosity and kindness over Christmas! The response to all of the requests of the parish has been amazing. We all look forward to the Holy Year of Hope 2025. With the opening of the Holy Door at the Vatican, which I saw last year, may we experience a year of faith, hope, and charity that renews our families and pours grace upon us.

If you have not been fully practicing or participating in your faith, there is no better time to ponder how God is calling you to a deeper response. Lord grant that I may love you always, never again let me be separated from you, then do with me what you will. – St. Alphonsus Liquori
