Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

DECEMBER 29, 2024

Sirach 3:2-6,12-14; Colossians 3:12-21; Luke 2:41-52

[There are alternate Biblical texts that may be used for the first and second readings.]

We desperately need fathers who sacrifice themselves for their families. We need fathers and mothers who are firm in discipline with their children, but in whose hearts Christ's peace and love always reigns.

Children will grow to be like their models, their parents: If parents are undisciplined, children will likewise be undisciplined. If parents are indifferent in their faith, we can't expect children to be any different. Today we pray that our families will model themselves after the Holy Family of Joseph, Mary, and Jesus.

Our first reading is from *Sirach*. In older Bibles, this book is called *Ecclesiasticus*, a word which means "Church Book." It was called that because it was the most frequently used Old Testament book in the liturgy. The book is Hebrew poetry, in couplets. Today's reading is plain common sense: Each member of the family needs to respect every other member. Each member of the family must realize his/her distinct role.

The second reading expands on this theme: Husbands are not wives, nor are wives husbands: each has a distinct role. Children are not parents; they must not usurp the parental role; nor can parents abdicate their responsibility to guide their children.

The Gospel scene is the finding of the child Jesus in the Temple. People banded together in great caravans to go up to Jerusalem for pilgrimage feasts. Apparently Joseph and Mary thought that Jesus was with the children in another part of the caravan; they panicked when they discovered that he was not with them.

They returned to Jerusalem to search for him, and found him speaking to the learned men of the Torah. When asked, Jesus says that he had to be in his Father's house. Nevertheless, he who was divine as well as human, went down to Nazareth and was subject to them.

The reflections here on family are many: The concern and solicitude of parents for the child ... The respect of the child for parents ... the humility of the divine child who returns to Nazareth and is subject to those who are inferior to him.

After a beautiful celebration of Christmas, the Church draws our attention to the reality that the Word of God, the Second Person of the Trinity, took on our flesh and blood and truly dwelt among us. What this means is the fact that Jesus was a part of a human family, learned what was important within the context of a human family, and experienced the love of his parents, Mary and Joseph. And so we celebrate this weekend, the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, a community of persons with differing roles to play, assisting each other in understanding of God's love expressed and shown within a family. As we celebrate the family life of Jesus, so it's important that we look at our own families, people who choose to love us, people who forgive us, and people who are patient and tolerant of our flaws and weaknesses and often poor decisions. And yet through it all, these parents challenge each of us to be our best. As we celebrate the Feast of the Family of Jesus, maybe today is a great opportunity to thank our God for the parents that we have as I am sure that Jesus was filled with gratitude for His parents.

In our gospel for this weekend, we find the Fifth Joyful Mystery, that mystery that speaks about Jesus' parents finding their son in the temple preaching. Mary and Joseph took Jesus when He was 12 years of age to Jerusalem for a pilgrimage as was their custom. However, as they were returning home in the caravan, Mary and Joseph thought that He was with relatives as they journeyed home. To their surprise, Jesus could not be located. Like any parent, I am sure they were devastated that they couldn't find Him among those journeying home. And so Mary and Jospeh returned to Jerusalem where they found Him in the "midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions." I can just imagine what they thought when they finally found Him. Then we hear Jesus asking them questions when He says, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" The gospel passage then says "but they did not understand what He said to them." That understanding would be revealed gradually to them as this child was "obedient to them, advancing in wisdom and age and favor before God and man." But there is a brief statement in that same gospel that most mothers can relate, namely, "His mother kept all these things in her heart" as most mothers do even though they do not understand their children.

This Wednesday, January 1, is the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. This Solemnity is also a Holyday of Obligation for all Catholics. To celebrate this Solemnity, we will have a Vigil Mass on Tuesday, December 31, at 5:00 p.m. Then the Mass on the Holyday itself, Wednesday, January 1, will be 8:00 and 10:00 a.m.


As we celebrate the New Year of our Lord, 2025, my prayer for each of you is found in our Book of Numbers:
