

December 8, 2024 Second Sunday of Advent — C

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan, pastor



Two candles are lit, doubling the light and counting down the time until Christmas in just over two weeks. We encounter the figure of John the Baptist in this Second Sunday of Advent. He is presented to us in a remarkably impersonal way in the third chapter of the Gospel of Luke... we hear the historical context of who the civil authorities were at the time—Caesar and Pilate and Herod. We hear that Annas and Caiaphas represented the religious leadership. Finally, we

hear that John was the son of the priest Zechariah, and that he proclaimed a baptism of repentance according to the words of the prophet Isaiah... but these words are not necessarily his own, they are the words of the prophet. It isn't until a few verses later, not heard in today's Gospel reading, that John comes out proclaiming the religious establishment a "brood of vipers!" (Lk 3:7) Perhaps this is not the most endearing introduction that Luke could have given this forerunner and prophet of the most high?

It isn't until next week we will hear the voice and sayings of John himself... "Whoever has two tunics should give one to the person who has none" (Lk 3:11). To tax collectors: "Stop collecting more than what is prescribed", to soldiers: "do not practice extortion, do not falsely accuse anyone, be satisfied with your daily wage" (Lk 13, 14). John is an awkward, challenging figure. There is an uneasiness and an anxiousness in his demands. With John, there is an urgency in his message, intended to be unsettling.

As we count the weeks of Advent, we remember that this season is not only about the coming of the Lord at Christmas, safely distanced from us by time and by space, but Advent is even more importantly oriented towards the urgent message that our Lord is coming soon at the end of our lives and at the end of our age. We have no time to waste. If as Christians we proclaim justice and moral excellence, we had better be living it... now! If we need to be cleansed in the waters of repentance and baptism, there is no better time than now! John would be caught in palace intrigue and his carrier land life would be ended suddenly for his efforts to proclaim the truth. He will disappear about as suddenly as he appeared... as if a blooming flower in the desert after a brief rain, but his message is most urgent and timely... the Kingdom of God is at hand!



Monday, December 9 is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. A clarification was sent from the Vatican about a month ago, stating that the Holy Day, when transferred from a Sunday, as it is in this unique case during Advent, is to be held as a Holy Day of Obligation. (This is unique to this feast, as if, for instance, the Feast of the Assumption falls on a Sunday during Ordinary Time, that 'green' Sunday is pre-empted... Advent Sundays, because of the importance to the integrity of the season, cannot be pre-empted, forcing the movement of the regular December 8 date!) Mass for the Holy Day will be on Monday at 7:30 a.m. and 630 p.m. at St. Anthony and 9:00 a.m. at St. Dominic.



Finally, this week, we have our parish mission on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, hosted by Sr. Clementia Toalson, FSGM. Thursday and Friday, December 12 & 13 will feature a talk at 6 p.m., followed by time for prayer and adoration. On Friday, local priests will be available to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. On Saturday, December 14 the talk will take place between the 4:00 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. evening Masses, followed by an ice cream social and vocations discussion for ages 16-30 in the Quilt Room. All are invited. Please spread the word far and wide... this is a season of hope for all who call upon the Lord!






