Second Sunday of Advent

DECEMBER 8. 2024

Baruch 5:1-9; Philippians 1:4-6,8-11; Luke 3:1-6

Although the book of Baruch speaks of the return of the Exiles from Babylonian Captivity (c. 539 B.C.), the book was probably written about 100 years before Jesus Christ.

It was written at Alexandria, Egypt, where many Jews were indifferent, and even embarrassed, by their faith. They enjoyed the high living of Hellenist culture. Baruch urges them to "look to the east" (i.e toward Jerusalem) to be delivered from corruption.

The Gospel begins with a solemn pronouncement of the time: "In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar ... Pontius Pilate, procurator of Judea ... Herod ... Philip ... Lysanias ... during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas..." We can hardly imagine a greater collection of corrupt scoundrels than these! Yet this is the setting for the preparation for the Messiah, John the Baptist's preaching.

We think that our own times are rotten, that violence and corruption are everywhere, that institutions no longer work, that the Church is retrenching, and that there seems to be no solution to our problems. In just such circumstances, God sent his Son to save us!

John the Baptist calls on us to prepare for his Coming: Straighten out the path of your life. Fill up the valleys of your depression. Bring down the mountains of your pride. Look for the salvation of God.

In the second reading, St. Paul urges us to learn what things have real value, and what is really worthless. Learn to choose what is of value so that we may be ready for the **Coming of Christ.**

Dear Parishioners,

On this Second Sunday of our season of Advent, the Church introduces us to a man named John the Baptist. As the introduction takes place in our gospel, Luke places John in the context of a historical time, "in the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor, Herod the tetrarch of Galilee, and during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas." It was in this historical context that we find John proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. He was fulfilling the words of the prophet Isaiah: "A voice of one crying out in the desert: Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight His paths." John became that prophet who ushered in a new era, an era of a Savior who would change the world and our relationship with our God. This Savior was born in history, suffered and died and rose, and will come again to bring His kingdom to fulfillment. Advent then is that time to prepare our lives and hearts for whenever Christ comes to us both in mystery and in history. Come Lord Jesus, Come!


It times past, whenever a Holyday of Obligation fell on a Monday or Saturday, the obligation was abrogated. This was always warmly received by the priests who would find himself doubling his Masses over a two day period. Recently, however, upon raising the question about obligations being abrogated, the Vatican answered by saying that this was no longer the case. If a Holyday fell on a Monday or Saturday, the obligation to attend Mass was still present. Because the Immaculate Conception, December 8, a Holyday of Obligation falls on a Sunday, and because the season of Advent takes precedence over the Holyday, this Holyday is then moved to Monday, December 9. And so Monday, December 9 becomes the Holyday of Obligation. This Solemnity celebrates the feast day of our country and diocese, under the title of Mary, the Immaculate Conception. In fact our Basilica in Washington D.C., along with our Cathedral in Springfield are named after Mary, under the title of the Immaculate Conception. This Solemnity proclaims that "from the first moment of her conception, Mary, by the singular grace of God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, was preserved immune from original sin. Our Mass schedule for this Solemnity is as follows:

Sunday, December 8, 6:00 p.m. Vigil Mass for the Holyday Monday, December 9, 8:30 Children's Mass, (10:00 a.m. Mass at QND) 12:10 Mass, and 6:00 p.m. Mass.

I do want to thank our parish family for remembering my nephew, Fr. Steve Arisman in your prayers. Through the efforts of doctors and nurses, as well as his family, but especially the grace of God, Fr. Steve is doing much better. He has a long road of recovery and will be doing so at his home in Springfield. Please continue to remember him in your prayers. +






