Baptism of the Lord

JANUARY 12, 2025

Isaiah 42:1-4,6-7 or Isaiah 40:1-5,9-11;

Acts 10:34-38 or Titus 2:11-14; 3:4-7;

Luke 3:15-16,21-22

The baptism of Jesus was his inaugural as the Suffering Servant of the Lord. Every prophet had an inaugural experience. Jesus' inaugural comes at his baptism. He identifies himself with sinful mankind by accepting a baptism leading to repentance and forgiveness. In so doing, he takes upon himself all the suffering and sins of the whole world.

The "Suffering Servant Songs" in Isaiah (of which our first reading is the first) tell of an "everyman" figure who humbles himself, who is gentle, and who takes all evil unto himself; by his own suffering, he vicariously heals all. This Suffering Servant Song begins with the words "Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one with whom I am well-pleased." In the original languages, these are almost identical with the words of the Father in the Gospel.

The Gospel according to Luke emphasizes the power of the Holy Spirit. In the baptism of Jesus, Luke emphasizes that the Spirit comes upon Jesus. Henceforth, everything he does is in the power of God. The dove was the symbol of Israel. The dove here may symbolize that Jesus becomes Israel personified – or the new Israel. In himself he will save all.

The second reading is the story of the conversion of Cornelius. God is no respecter of persons; Jesus came to save all peoples of all times and places.

In our baptism, we are freed from sin precisely because in his baptism Jesus took to himself the suffering and sinfulness of the world. Jesus' other "baptism" is when he gives his life for the sake of us all; he strips away all sin and nails it to the cross. Through this "baptism" he empowers the sacraments to be signs of his salvation among us.

Today we receive a very poignant reminder...

“No one can receive anything

Today we are challenged with the concept of **authenticity**. Do we get into the practice of acknowledging from where our gifts and blessings come?

This simple exhortation will remind us.

“He must increase; I must decrease.”

It is through this constant prayer that we move, **authentically**, closer to God, receiving our gifts gratefully, honing them and lovingly sharing them. As I've said so many times... it's all about Love.

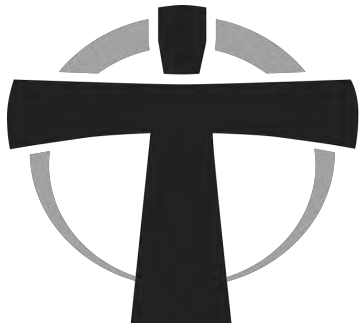

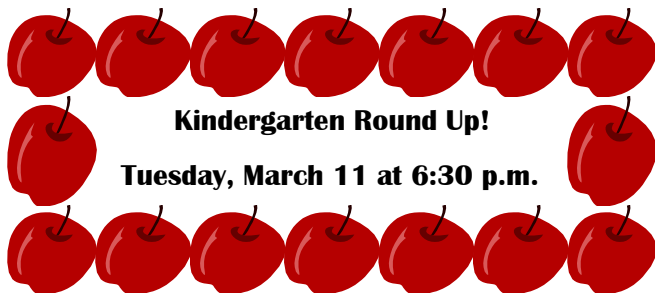
A Message from Dr. Chris Gill, Chief Administrative Leader, Quincy Catholic Elementary Schools on the School Financial Education Sessions:

In response to valuable community feedback, financial education sessions were recently held in December at each of the four parishes to provide an in-depth look at the financial dynamics of Quincy Catholic Schools. These sessions were designed to ensure transparency and help the community understand the financial picture of our Catholic elementary schools.

Key topics covered included school income and expenses, parish support for schools, fiscal year income, and the financial challenges faced by our parishes. Highlights emphasized that payroll and benefits represent the largest expenses, and projections show a growing parish subsidy will be needed over the next three years due to anticipated enrollment trends. The sessions underscored the shared responsibility of tithing and the vital role it plays in sustaining our schools.

The Provisional Advisory Board and the Corporate Board remain actively engaged in evaluating the future of Quincy Catholic Schools to determine the best path forward. Updates will be shared as more information becomes available.
