## *Second Sunday in Ordinary Time*

**JANUARY 19, 2025**

Isaiah 62:1-5; 1 Corinthians 12:4-11;  
John 2:1-11

We return to “Ordinary Time”, the season of the life of the Church. Green is the color of life and of hope; our vestments and altar frontals will be green until Lent begins (March 6). Because of the Gospel selection, today is often called “Cana Sunday.” The basic story is simple: Jesus and his followers go to a wedding feast; the host runs short of wine; Mary tells Jesus who seemingly rebuffs her. Mary tells the waiters to do whatever Jesus says. Jesus then changes the water into wine.

But the rest of the story is much deeper. John’s Gospel always has at least two levels, one obvious and one deeper and not so obvious. The purpose of John’s Gospel is to show the replacement of all the forms of Judaism with something new and better.

Jesus works seven “signs” to do this. This first sign alludes to the Jewish manner of purification (the water jars). This is replaced by the lavish (about 125-150 gallons) new wine of Christ (representing the grace of love and salvation). Jesus calls his mother “woman”, alluding to the “woman” in Genesis 3:15 whose son will stamp out evil. The old woman Eve and her heritage is replaced by the new woman, the Church, represented by Mary. The marriage of God to Israel is replaced by the marriage of the Church to Christ. The theme is newness, richness, joy, and love.

Do you think you are a nobody? Then you’ll act like one! But if you think that you are a beloved son or daughter of God, you should act as one. The second reading tells us that God has given each of us distinct talents and gifts. And he calls on us to “give them away”, to use them in service to others for the building up of the Church.

Insofar as we try to serve others and “give away” our gifts, the Lord will lavish on us even more abundantly. Let us pray to know our gifts and to use them in joy for others. If we seek to serve, we shall be amazed at

### Catechesis on the Jubilee 2025 #1

#### General Introduction

In February 2022, Pope Francis announced that the Universal Church would celebrate a jubilee year in 2025 with the theme, *Pilgrims of Hope*. The jubilee year coincides with and marks the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord. To prepare well for this landmark event, the pope enjoined on all to embrace fervent prayers and the study of four documents of the Second Vatican Council: Constitution on the Sacred

Liturgy (*Sacrosanctum Concilium*), Dogmatic Constitution on the Church (*Lumen Gentium*), Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation (*Dei Verbum*) and Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World (*Gaudium et Spes*).

The 2025 Jubilee is here with us. It began with the opening of the Holy Door by Pope Francis at St. Peter's Basilica Rome on December 24, 2024, the eve of Christmas. The jubilee spans 2025 and ends on January 6, 2026, the feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. The jubilee year offers the faithful opportunities to participate in various jubilee events at the Vatican and in their own dioceses. One may ask, what is a jubilee year? The word, "jubilee" in its modern-day usage depicts a special anniversary, especially that of 25<sup>th</sup> or 50<sup>th</sup>. In the Catholic Church, the word "jubilee" as used in the jubilee year is derived from the Hebrew word *jobel*, which means "ram's horn;" since it was precisely that horn which was used as a trumpet, whose sound indicated to everybody the beginning of the jubilee year. The jubilee year has a biblical origin. The code of holiness in the book of Leviticus indicates the jubilee year as a year of liberation: "And you shall hallow the fiftieth year, and proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants; it shall be a jubilee for you, when each of you shall return to his property and each of you shall return to his family" (*Leviticus 25:10*).

In the Catholic Church, the jubilee year is a special period now ordinarily every 25th year in which special indulgences are granted. Both in the Hebrew jubilee year of Leviticus and the present Church's usage, the jubilee year is a time for forgiveness. It stands as a reminder of God's providence and mercy. It provides people with privileged time to come back into right relationship with one another and with God. The first jubilee in the Church was declared by Pope Boniface VIII on February 22, 1300, the feast of the chair of St. Peter to mark the beginning of that century. He later recommended that it be observed every 100 years. Various other popes amended the length of the interval between the observances. However, it was Pope Paul II who set the present 25 years interval in 1470.

Today in the Church we talk of ordinary and extraordinary jubilee year. The holy years of Jubilee are ordinary when they occur at regular intervals, that is, 25 years and extraordinary when they are proclaimed for a special reason like the extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy of 2016 declared by Pope Francis. The 2025 Jubilee, which has the theme, *Pilgrims of Hope*, is a year of Hope – hope and trust for a world suffering the impacts of war, social unrest, and the increased threats to the climate.


