

Jubilee Year: Pilgrims of Hope - Indulgences, Part II.

Here's how last week's example of gasoline service stations serve the purpose of explaining indulgences. Service station, suppliers; oil, gasoline, additives; methods of transport and delivery: always operating, whether you get gasoline or not. The Holy Trinity and the Mystical Body of Christ - the saints and angels in heaven, the Church on earth, and the souls in purgatory - is always in operation, with divine love perpetually offering purification of souls, whether we consciously take advantage of that purification or not. The vast majority of time that you and I never pull into a service station doesn't affect the entirety of a continual system of operation.

That you and I would rarely if ever enter into the practice of indulgences doesn't affect the entirety of the perpetual purification taking place in the Mystical Body of Christ, in the mystery of the Holy Trinity. And when you get your gasoline, you're participating, cooperating, investing yourself in this entire operation, for either your vehicle, or on occasion, for someone else's. When you "indulge" in the purifying power of the love of the Holy Trinity in the Mystical Body of Christ, you're participating, cooperating, investing yourself in this perpetual purification, for either yourself, or for the souls of the faithful departed. Either way, you direct the entire operation of production and delivery to a specific vehicle: a gift from the service station, and a choice of yours, to draw from the gift. God gives us the invitation to intentionally direct the entire operation of divine purification to a specific soul: a gift from God, and a choice of yours, to draw from the gift. Next week: purification from what? What difference does it make, if it's going on all the time, anyway? Fr. T.

Do you want to build a snowman -or- Start an online BIBLE STUDY &/or PODCAST?! Happy New 2025 Year! Even though this has already started, all are welcome to join at any time!

<u>FIRST</u>, we will be using the new study, "Luke: The Story of Salvation Fulfilled". Online access is at **ascensionpress.com**. The total cost is \$7.37 per person and access is given for the study materials for one year. When paying for the study be sure to set up an account and not check out as a guest. After payment is confirmed you should see at your **ascensionpress.com/account** screen a tan button on the upper left side entitled "Study Dashboard". The study should be there soon if not immediately. There are eight sessions with the first session being introductory so there is not any bible preparation needed for that session. The first short zoom meeting will be on Wednesday, January 22 at 7:00 p.m. Read through session one and watch the video before the zoom session.

<u>SECOND</u>, Ascension Press is beginning a new FREE podcast on Wednesday, January 15 entitled LUKE IN 50 DAYS. "In each episode, Fr. Mike Schmitz will read a section of Luke's Gospel. Jeff Cavins and Scott Powell will provide commentary and insight about the beautiful prose and unique parables." This podcast should be available on most podcast apps.

Hope this all makes sense! Basically, everyone will be doing their own study questions and video. We will come together as a zoom group to discuss our answers. Participate when you can.
