## Third Sunday in Ordinary Time JANUARY 26, 2025

Nehemiah 8:2-4a,5-6,8-10; 1 Corinthians 12:12-30 or 12: 12-14, 27; Luke 1:1-4;4:14-21

Except for Lent and Easter, all of our Sunday Gospels will be taken from the Gospel of Luke this year. Luke is the only non-Jewish writer of any book of the Bible. He was well-educated; he was a doctor; he accompanied Paul on some of his missionary journeys. Luke has a sense of delicacy, and he often smoothes the "rough" language of Mark. He omits anything which would be offensive to good taste. His Gospel emphasizes the Lord's mercy and forgiveness. Luke takes note of secular history, and places Jesus in historical perspective. Women play a very important part in Luke's Gospel. Remember these characteristics as you read Luke this year.

Today's Gospel contains the first four verses of the Gospel; then it skips to the time immediately after Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist. Jesus goes to his hometown synagogue, opens the scroll of Isaiah to give the reading. He then sits down and proclaims that the reading has been fulfilled in their presence! The Spirit of the Lord is upon him. He is anointed to proclaim Good News to all.

The first reading today describes the renewal of the covenant under Ezra about 450 B.C. Moses had received the Torah from the Lord on Mt. Sinai about the year 1290 B.C. Then the Israelites had promised to be loyal to the covenant, but they were not. Because of their constant infidelity, the nation was destroyed, and they were captives at Babylon from 587 to 538 B.C. God delivered them; they returned home; and under Ezra they renewed their pledge of loyalty to the covenant. "Amen" means "with all my heart and soul, I agree to this!"

The second reading continues Paul's discussion on the use of all our gifts and talents for the building up of the Church. The Church is the Body of Christ. Although we shall use the short form of the reading at Mass today, read and reflect on the longer form. Each of us receives the one Body of Christ in Holy Communion. We are united with him. Through our union with the Person or Body of Christ, we become one Body in him! Therefore we must show our unity with each other by our bonds of love and caring. Each person must seek to contribute to the upbuilding of the Body of Christ, and not to tearing it apart.


#### Dear Parishioners,

As we gather this weekend, the Church continues to celebrate "ordinary time" as we celebrate the Third Sunday. This weekend also happens to be the last weekend in our month of January as well as the weekend that begins what we call "Catholic Schools Week." Each of these weekends give us cause to rejoice and celebrate our Eucharist together.

In our gospel for this weekend, we find a very dramatic scene taking place in Luke's presentation. In this gospel, Jesus returns to His hometown of Nazareth and "went according to custom into the synagogue on the sabbath." News of Him had spread throughout the area so people were open to whatever message this hometown rabbi had for them. In a dramatic scene, "He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah." He unrolled it and read the passage about the Spirit of the Lord being upon Him, because He was the anointed one to bring glad tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, recovery of sight to the blind, and the oppressed going free. He rolled it back up and in a most profound statement proclaimed, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." The mission of Jesus is fulfilled in this passage that He read. Jesus has entered our world to set us free, free from all those things that have held us bondage here on earth. He has entered our world to set us free and to give us His abundant life. Perhaps the summary of Jesus' message to us is found in the simplicity of our responsorial psalm as we prayed "Your words Lord are spirit and life."

As we celebrate this last weekend in our month of January, the Church as stated celebrates what we call "Catholic School's Week." This is the week in our calendar year that we reflect on the reason and purpose that we have a Catholic school. Our Catholic schools were founded in the beginning of our country to protect and promote the Catholic faith. Many of the "public schools" at the founding of our country were religious schools which promoted their particular denominations. There was very little separation of Church from state in the early days. In order to protect and promote the Catholic faith among many of the early immigrants, a Catholic school was established in most parishes. Dependent upon the parish, these Catholic schools often taught in the language of the immigrants but always with the idea that the products would assimilate into the new culture of America. And they did. These schools became quite prosperous from grade, to high, and even to college levels of education. These parochial schools thrived and became the tool of evangelization for Catholic Churches through the centuries. And these same schools remain these same tools, supported by our parishioners who want to protect and promote our Catholic faith. And so today, we honor these schools and take pride in what we are and what we have produced over the years. I just wish those who were a part of our school system would remain products of what they learned and continue that same learning curve with their children, especially with the Eucharist being the center of their lives. students this weekend will be actively participating in our celebrations as we begin National Catholic School's Week. And I thank our parishioners for making sure that our Catholic school of St. Peter remains alive and viable and growing as we meet the future for our young people.






