## Jubilee Year: Pilgrims of Hope - Indulgences, Part III.

Since we're nearing the Super Bowl contest between the Kansas City Chiefs and the Philadelphia Eagles, let's answer last weekend's closing questions -"Purification from what? What difference does it make, if purification is going on in the Mystical Body of Christ all the time, anyway?"- by taking a closer look at these teams. The one thing you know about them is that they have developed to be powerhouses in the world of American professional football. You know they're good: you don't have to mention the names of individual players. Mention the names of these teams, and you know they're among the best. And when a player joins teams such as these, there are two things that happen: 1. The athlete becomes a part of something that has already accomplished something without him, which helps the athlete; and 2. The athlete adds to the powerful reputation of the team, a combination of the strength the team already has, but now something of that power further produced by what the new athlete brings to the team. You see, in the spiritual reality of Indulgences, the Mystical Body of Christ has the power of purification of the soul already established; this power is the grace of Jesus Christ himself. But if you "indulge" - participate and invest in, and cooperate with, - Christ's grace, there's something more of the Lord's grace that is increased by virtue of <u>His</u> work, in <u>your</u> work. It's all the Lord's work of purification of the soul, and it's increased by His partnering with you in your participation in an Indulgence. This is what the Church means by "the Treasury of the Saints". This treasury purifies the souls of the faithful departed, or your own soul, from the effects of sins already forgiven. That's what the purification is about. What difference does it make? You're a part of the team, which helps you; and because of that, you add to what the team already has to offer, plus that much more! You're "in" on the Lord's purifying power in the Mystical Body of Christ!

**Do you want to build a snowman -or- Start an online BIBLE STUDY &/or PODCAST?!** Happy New 2025 Year! Even though this has already started, all are welcome to join at any time!

<u>FIRST</u>, we will be using the new study, "Luke: The Story of Salvation Fulfilled". Online access is at **ascensionpress.com**. The total cost is \$7.37 per person and access is given for the study materials for one year. When paying for the study be sure to set up an account and not check out as a guest. After payment is confirmed you should see at your **ascensionpress.com/account** screen a tan button on the upper left side entitled "Study Dashboard". The study should be there soon if not immediately. There are eight sessions with the first session being introductory so there is not any bible preparation needed for that session. The first short zoom meeting will be on Wednesday, January 22 at 7:00 pm. Read through session one and watch the video before the zoom session.

<u>SECOND</u>, Ascension Press is beginning a new FREE podcast on Wednesday, January 15 entitled LUKE IN 50 DAYS. "In each episode, Fr. Mike Schmitz will read a section of Luke's Gospel.
