The Presentation of the Lord Feast, February 2, 2025

Dear Parishioners.

After celebrating several weeks of Ordinary Time, the Church takes a break in this time to celebrate a Feast, namely, the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. This particular feast is celebrated 40 days after Christmas. The reason for this celebration is that according to Jewish law, the parents of a Jewish child were to present their child in the Temple offering in sacrifice a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons. According to the law of Moses, every child was to be consecrated to the Lord and by offering this sacrifice, the parents then were able to redeem their child and then take the child home to be raised by them. If you remember the last plague before the Exodus, the first born males of both man and animal died unless they were redeemed by the blood of the lamb over the homes of the Jewish family. And so today, 40 days after Christmas (remember the Exodus of 40 years) was very significant as it challenged parents to remember that their child was consecrated to God and through this sacrifice it was not their responsibility to remind them that this life truly belonged to God.

In this time in the Temple, they met up with a man named Simeon, "a righteous and devout man, awaiting the consolation of Israel." He ends up blessing the child and proclaiming how this child would be a "revelation to the Gentiles and the glory for your people Israel." No words would be more fulfilled than his. But then he also said something to Mary that she didn't understand but would in time reflect in her life, when he said, "that Jesus is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and was to be a sign that would be contracted"—and then looking to Mary he would say, "and you yourself a sword will pierce so that the thoughts of many would be revealed." This sword would be known today as Mary's seven sorrows. These include the following: the prophecy of Simeon; the flight into Egypt; the loss of the boy Jesus in the Temple; meeting Jesus on the way of the cross; the crucifixion of Jesus; the taking down of Jesus from the cross; and the burial of Jesus. These seven sorrows reflect the sorrows of a Mother who endured so much without understanding any of them. It was only after the resurrection that her sorrows turned to joy. And so to all our mothers, we offer Mary as their patron and ask her help to assist them in the sorrows that often occur in their role as mothers. Our Lady of Sorrows, pray for us now and always.

This weekend also begins our new month of February. Fortunately, this month only has 28 days, with the thoughts of winter coming to an end and the thoughts of Spring beginning to arise in our wishes. Be patient, Spring is right around the corner.

Our meeting with the Commission of Buildings and Property in Springfield last Thursday went very well. We received their tentative approval but still have to continue to dot our i's and cross our t's as we follow the directions of the diocese. Needless to say, they were impressed with our plans and our representatives from Klingner and Associates made quite a showing. I was very proud of their presentation as each of you would have been. Now we have to continue to honor our pledges and continue our fund-raising so that the financial burden of our plans will be met. Thank you again for all who participated. Be proud!



Haiti Sister Parish Update

Father Michel contacted Father Leo and the Haiti Sister Parish committee with an update on the conditions in Haiti. Recently the rains have been severe in the region. Although Father has been able to say Mass with no problem in Passe-Reine, it's been a challenge to reach the mountain churches. Roads have turned into mud and become impassable. Father Michel and his servers were forced to walk from Passe-Reine to Garoty for Christmas services. When they finally arrived, his parishioners were waiting. He said it brought him great "joy" to see them.

Gangs still impact life in Haiti. Over one hundred and fifty elderly people were killed in the Artibonite diocese, where Our Lady of the Assumption Church is located.

Father Michel continues to seek ways to bring God and the Church into the lives of young children and youth. Recently he established two groups, Prophet Amos and Hearts of the Angels for that purpose.

Father Michel is most appreciative of the recent monetary donation he received from St. Peter Parish. He continues to pray for us and asks that we pray for him and his parishioners.
