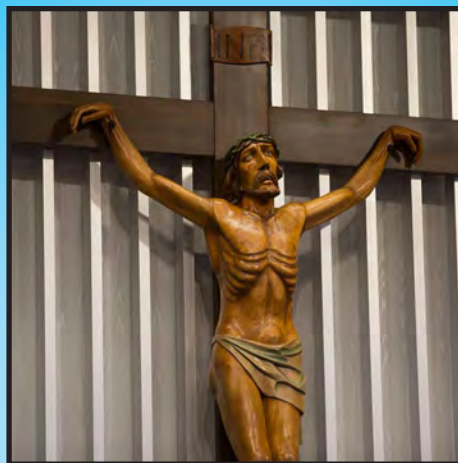

February 16, 2025 Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Blessed are they who hope in the Lord! In the sixth chapter of Luke, Jesus pronounces blessings to the poor, the hungry, the weeping, and the persecuted, while proclaiming curses at the rich, the full, those who laugh, and those of good repute. Blessings are a promise of God's life, curses are the realization of his distance. What is it that keeps the downtrodden close to the heart of God, while the well-to-do struggle? I think it is the lie of self-sufficiency. If we are poor, hungry, weeping, and persecuted, we have no other means of salvation other than God. In happiness, fullness, laughter, and respect, we tend to look away from God and revel in being 'self-made' people... of receiving what is deserved for us... of being secure in the things of

this world for the time being. While the words of the Lord seem harsh, the intent, it seems, is to ask us to break the cycle of self-deception when we are full in the things of this world, and to place our trust in God alone.

It is time to identify candidates who would be interested in becoming Catholic by way of the **Order of Christian Initiation of Adults**. How do we get new Catholics to join the Church? We must personally welcome them and mentor them in the faith! Is this the year for your spouse? Your son/daughter-in-law? Your parent(s)? Your neighbor or colleague at work? Seventh Grade Class Performs Skits About the Virtue of Temperance



During the month of February, our seventh-grade class has been performing skits to see if the students can recognize when we need temperance. Have you ever done something and then later felt bad about it or even embarrassed about it? One way we are reminded that we need to practice temperance is when we experience shame or remorse. The seventh-grade class explained that your conscience helps us back away from things that are evil or not good for us. When we have done something wrong and have thought it, it is common to feel bad or guilty and experience shame or remorse. This means we have a good conscience and recognize that we have sinned. The skits performed by the seventh-graders demonstrated choices we make to use temperance in order to help us avoid experiencing shame, regret, and even sin.
