Unless you have faith, it is pretty stupid for you to be in Church! I mean, why on earth would anyone want to "love his enemies and do good to those who hate?" It is not natural.

The natural thing is to do to others as they do to us to repay evil with justice: Get even! Don't let anyone get by with anything! The philosophy of this world is "self interest." Oh, yes, we may try to be a bit "humane," but most of us like a bit of vengeance.

Our Christian outlook is radically different from the philosophy of this world. By nature, we are as selfish as anyone else. But God calls us to reflect his unselfishness, his mercy, his love.

Our first reading tells of David and Saul. King Saul was paranoid. He tried constantly to kill David. David has the opportunity to settle scores, but he has pity on the king.

Jesus calls us to bless those who curse us, to turn the other cheek, to love our enemies, to be compassionate as our heavenly Father is compassionate. He calls on us to do to others as God does to us. When we were God's enemies by sin, God sent his only Son to save us. His Son died for us.

It takes great faith to love enemies and to do good to those who hate us. We need to pray for that kind of faith. Christianity is not easy; it is a constant struggle to have Christ's values instead of the values of this world. Keep praying and struggling to follow Christ.

7TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Examples of Christians showing great mercy to those who have wronged them often make the news. Most famously was Saint Pope John Paul II forgiving Mehmet Ali Agca who had shot him. The picture of the two sitting together and the pope speaking to his would-be assassin is iconic. One can see themselves in the picture with Christ sitting there talking to them. The pope's words are spoken in today's Gospel when he says, "pray for my brother...whom I have sincerely forgiven".

In the first reading, David will not allow Saul to be harmed, even though Saul has pursued David and intends to kill him. David still will not allow Saul to be harmed because he is the Lord's anointed. David seeks to allow God to be the judge of Saul and will not take the matter into his own hands even though Saul has been delivered to him. David will fail in many ways but he will always seek to return to God and to trust in His mercy.

Jesus tells the Apostles how they are to live.

"Be merciful, just also as your Father is merciful.

Stop judging and you will not be judged.

Stop condemning and you will not be condemned.

Forgive and you will be forgiven.

Give and gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down, and overflowing...".

Let us do an examination and ensure we are living by these essential and core instructions given to us by Christ. We will never be more merciful, loving, or generous than God. Go ahead, try to outdo God. Your reward will be greater!


