1 Samuel 26:2,7-9,12-13,22-23;
1 Corinthians 15:45-49; Luke 6:27-38

Unless you have faith, it is pretty stupid for you to be in Church! I mean, *why on earth would anyone want to “love his enemies and do good to those who hate?”* It is not natural.

The natural thing is to do to others as they do to us to repay evil with justice: Get even! Don't let anyone get by with anything! The philosophy of this world is “self interest.” Oh, yes, we may try to be a bit “humane,” but most of us like a bit of vengeance.

Our Christian outlook is radically different from the philosophy of this world. By nature, we are as selfish as anyone else. But God calls us to reflect his unselfishness, his mercy, his love.

Our first reading tells of David and Saul. King Saul was paranoid. He tried constantly to kill David. David has the opportunity to settle scores, but he has pity on the king.

Jesus calls us to bless those who curse us, to turn the other cheek, to love our enemies, to be compassionate as our heavenly Father is compassionate. He calls on us to do to others as God does to us. When we were God's enemies by sin, God sent his only Son to save us. His Son died for us.

It takes great faith to love enemies and to do good to those who hate us. We need to pray for that kind of faith. Christianity is not easy; it is a constant struggle to have Christ's values instead of the values of this world. Keep praying and struggling to follow Christ.

Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 23, 2025

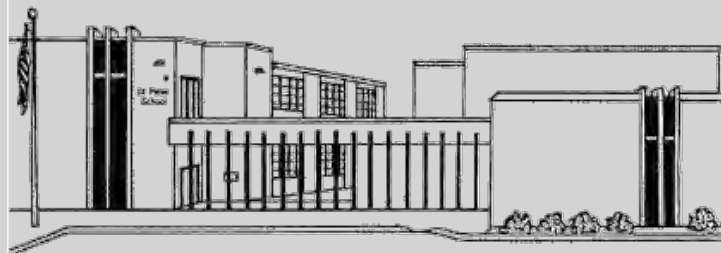
Dear Parishioners,

We gather on this last weekend of February to celebrate the 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The month of January seemed to pass so slowly whereas this month of February has come and gone without much notice. Whatever the case, after this recent bout of winter weather the hope of Spring is right around the corner. At least that's what the calendar states although mother nature never seems to abide with dates on a calendar. But we can always hope as we await the coming of Spring.

I remember my grade school days. The good sisters would continually remind us of what was known as the golden rule. Although Jesus Himself never called it the "golden rule" yet this rule has come down through history as very golden if only we lived by it. This "golden rule" is found in our gospel for our Mass this weekend, as we hear Jesus proclaiming it to His disciples, "Do to others as you would have them do to you." In other words, treat others the way we want to be treated. That seems fair and right although Jesus takes this golden rule even a step further. He tells us to "love your enemies." That might be pushing it but there is wisdom in that statement. But He continues to push the limits in our lives. "Do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who maltreat you. To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well, and from the person who takes your cloak, do not withhold your tunic." Now there is not one of us who likes to be taken advantage of, nor to be used by others. But as I said, there is wisdom in the insights Jesus gives us today in this gospel. He expects more from His followers because through these expectations, this is how we change people and our world. If we love only those who love us, there is no credit in that. Even sinners love those who love them. But Jesus pushes us, challenges us, without expecting anything in return. Our reward as He tells us, we will be children of the Most High. So this reading challenges us today. Let's begin by looking at our families. How many of us still carry grudges from years ago because we were not treated fairly or someone took advantage of us. We've carried that a long time and its time that we give it up and follow the wisdom of Jesus in this gospel. Remember, the "measure with which we measure will in turn be measured out to you." And that's a tough statement to swallow let alone live.

Next Saturday, our 3rd graders will be going to the Cathedral in Springfield to celebrate the last sacraments of their Initiation, namely, Confirmation and their First Communion. Bishop Paprocki will be celebrating these sacraments for our young people on Saturday morning. Because I have a wedding here at St. Peter, and because this wedding had been scheduled a year in advance, I will not be able to attend this important celebration for our young people and their families. But we are planning on having our own celebration that Sunday, March 2 at the 11:00 a.m. Mass. I ask that our parish pray for these young people as they receive these Sacraments and will become greater participants in the life of the Church. May the Eucharist be a weekly celebration for them and their families, growing ever closer to our Lord. And may the Holy Spirit inspire them and guide them to be those disciples of Jesus, living His life and doing His will.

40 Days For Life

40 Days for Life – the nation's most innovative, peaceful prayer outreach – is coming to Quincy for its third campaign. We are eager to join together with people of faith and conscience from our city to pray for an end to abortion.

40 Days for Life begins March 05 and runs through April 12. We want to prevent abortion from coming to Quincy. Chemical abortions make up the majority (>65%) of abortions and Walgreen and CVS corporations are on their way to becoming the largest abortion providers in the country.

The campaign will feature a peaceful 40-day prayer vigil in the public right-of-way outside of Walgreens on Broadway between 17th and 18th streets. All prayer vigil participants are asked to sign a statement of peace, pledging to conduct themselves in a Christ-like manner at all times.
