Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

FEBRUARY 9, 2025

Isaiah 6:1-2a,3-8; 1 Corinthians 15:1-11; Luke 5:1-11

From all eternity, God knew you! From all eternity, he planned to create you! From all eternity, he called you to be perfect as he is perfect! Everyone of us has a call from God to be a saint. Everyone of us has a call from God to serve him in a way which is unique: No other human being who will ever live will ever be able to give God the specific honor and glory that you, in your uniqueness can!

Today we reflect on our individual and specific call from God. What does God want you to do with your life? To know this and to follow it is the only way you'll ever be happy in this life and in the next! The first reading of Mass tells of the call of Isaiah. The scene is the splendor of God's glory in the temple. Isaiah protests that he is a sinner; God cleanses his sin, and asks whom he will send. Isaiah answers what we must answer: "Here I am, send me!"

Paul had been a terrible persecutor of the Church. Yet God called him to conversion of heart. Paul was unworthy, but God called him to be an apostle. Paul recognizes his sinfulness, but says that God's grace can do anything... even make him an apostle.

The Gospel tells of the call of Peter. We can hardly imagine a less likely person to be an apostle. He had hoof in mouth disease. He was impetuous. He was dense. He was good at fishing, but little else. He asks the Lord to leave him alone, for he is a sinner. Yet Jesus calls him to be "father of men."

Reflect on your own personal call from God. Especially today reflect and pray about our need for young men to respond to Christ's call to his priesthood. Jesus Christ is calling some from this very parish to be priests. Pray that they will have the strength to answer his call. May they – and all of us – answer God's call as Isaiah did: "Here I am, send me!"

What are our excuses for not doing God's work? Lack of talent? Sinfulness? Weakness? The Lord won't allow our excuses. He forgives. He empowers. He enables us to do things beyond our natural abilities. Don't refuse him.

Dear Parishioners,


Last weekend, those who put any stock in the predictions of Punxsutawney Phil were saddened to hear that he saw his shadow. According to this prognosticator, we are then supposed to have six more weeks of winter. I'm ready for this groundhog to go back into his burrow and not be seen again. These past several days with temperatures in the 60's followed by freezing rain, I am more than ready for winter to come to an end.

Last weekend we took a break from Ordinary time and celebrated the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple. The Church this week returns to Ordinary Time as it celebrates the 5th Sunday. Our readings this weekend consider the experiences of two people who were touched in their lives by the mystery of God. The first experience was the prophet Isaiah. Isaiah had a vision in which the glory of the Lord was revealed to him. Because of that vision, Isaiah felt so unworthy and his response was "woe to me, I am doomed! I am a man of unclean lips, living among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!" In spite of this experience of the glory of God, in spite of his feeling of unworthiness, the Lord touched his life with His mercy and forgiveness and removed his wickedness. Realizing what the Lord God did, Isaiah with a heart touched by God responded with a willingness to serve God. He was so moved by what the Lord did for him that he responded with the words, "here I am, Lord, send me."

Our gospel is the story of another man who was touched by the glory of the Lord in his life. We find Jesus getting in the boat of Peter and being asked to be taken out into the sea so that Jesus could teach the crowds from the boat. After a time of preaching, Jesus asks Peter to put into the deep water to throw out their nets. Peter who was exhausted after fishing all night, reluctantly did as Jesus asked. To his surprise, they caught such a large number of fish that the net was ready to tear. The glory of the Lord was revealed to Peter in this catch of fish. And Peter's response was one of unworthiness as he fell to his knees and said to Jesus, "depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." But Jesus had plans for Peter and the other disciples as He said to them, "Do not be afraid, from now on you will be catching men." Like Isaiah, Peter and the others left everything and followed Jesus. When the Lord calls us, we are expected to respond. He calls us at our baptisms to follow Him and live a life of holiness. Even though when He so often reveals His glory to us in differing ways, we might find ourselves unworthy, yet, He still calls us to follow Him and equips us with the necessary talents to fulfill this call.

As we reflect upon our readings today, we so often excuse ourselves from following Jesus because we feel unworthy or sinful, or whatever negative vice you can think of. But God takes each of us where we are, with all of our negative thoughts about ourselves, and then asks us to open up our hearts and our lives to Him so that He can work in and through us. And I truly believe that our God continues to call especially our young people to serve Him in the Church. I only wish our parents would see that call and encourage it in their young people. May each of us discover God's call as we respond, "here I am, Lord, send me."
