Second Sunday of Lent

MARCH 16, 2025

Genesis 15:5-12,17-18; Philippians 3:17—4:1 Luke 9:28b-36

Close your eyes; imagine yourself on Mt. Tabor with the Lord Jesus Christ as he is transfigured in glory. His divinity shines through his humanity. Brilliant, awesome, radiant, ecstatic. How can you describe the scene? But wait: Only three disciples ever saw this glory, and they only saw it once in their lives. Jesus is the divine Son of God at all times; but he did not show it.

Now imagine yourself transfigured in glory! Yes, you are a child of God; he lives in you; you share his life through baptism. You are a temple of the Holy Spirit, a member of Christ's own Body. But you can't see that glory; you must have faith to realize your dignity.

If you had this kind of faith, how would you act? Would not every thought, word, and deed of yours be different if you realized the glory of God within you? Well, realize it! Think of it! And act accordingly. By your baptism, you received this glory. You may have hidden that glory by indifference, weakness, or sin. But now is the time to repent, restore, and renew.

Abraham saw the glory of God when he made a covenant with him. God promised to be Abraham's God; he promised to bless him. Abraham promised to be faithful. We enter the covenant with God through Christ in our baptism. Let us be loyal.

In the second reading, Paul reminds us that we, too, will be transfigured: The Lord will give a new form to these bodies of ours so that his glory shines through. Let us live, even now, as citizens of heaven.

In the Gospel scene, the "cloud" is the cloud of God's glory. It appears in the Exodus, engulfing the tabernacle; it appears when Solomon dedicates the temple; it will also be the cloud into which Jesus enters in the ascension. The three "booths" of Peter probably refer to the Jewish feast of Succoth, which was the most joyful and glorious of Jewish festivals. Peter, in his limping way, is probably saying, "This is better than Succoth! Don't let it end!" Moses and Elijah summarize the entire old covenant: the Law and the Prophets.


Dear Parishioners,

On this Second Sunday of Lent, the Church gives us a glimpse of what is called a "religious experience." This is an experience of our Lord, His presence, His divinity, and His Love made manifest to us in a special way. Sometimes this religious experience comes from a retreat type of experience in which we are so moved and God becomes so real and present to us. Or often it comes to us from and experience of God in nature, as a beautiful sunset, or a mountain-type experience in which God seems so present and real to us. Whatever the experience, God gives us this glimpse of Himself to strengthen us, to reassure us, and to assist us in our struggles in life. Well today, we get a glimpse of two religious experiences of differing peoples in our readings. The first experience shared is that of Abram. God takes Abram outside and said, "look up at the sky and count the stars if you can." Then God enters into a covenant relationship with Abram through a sacrifice. This religious experience solidified Abram in his faith and trust in the God who promised him to be the Father of many peoples. The second experience is the mountain-type experience of the apostles Peter, James, and John. Jesus had just finished teaching them that He would have to go to Jerusalem, to be betrayed, to suffer, and to die. This was something that neither of them wanted to hear because they did not fully understand. In spite of the message, what Jesus did next was to give them a glimpse of His divinity. While praying, the face of Jesus changed in appearance and His clothing became dazzling white. And behold, Moses and Elijah were present conversing with Him. The apostles saw His glory and did not want to leave the moment. This happens so often with religious experiences. God gives us a glimpse of Himself and we want to hang onto it forever. None of us ever want to leave the mountain-type experience. We, like Peter, would like to say to Jesus, "It's good that we are here. Let us make three tents, one for you, Jesus, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." We, like the apostles, want to stay and never leave the experience. But as always, we have to journey back down the mountain to everyday life and continue with our struggles, always able to appreciate the experience given to us as the apostles appreciated their experience. Through such religious experiences, God strengthens us and give us a sense of hope and something to which we look forward to in the future.

Next Tuesday and Wednesday, the priests of the diocese will be attending their annual priest spring gathering in Collinsville. We all have to be present for the 1:00 Meeting and so Fr. Paul and I will be leaving on Tuesday morning after our Masses. I will be returning later Tuesday evening and will be having our Wednesday morning and evening Masses. Please pray for us as we are away.

I recently wrote the diocese, asking permission to begin the process of moving some of our utilities in anticipation of the construction of our new building. These needed to be moved before we even begin to start the construction. And so we are awaiting the permission to begin this first step in our construction. Also, an update: our plans for construction have been sent out for bids from differing companies. I will let you know the final bid when it is awarded. Then we have to write the diocese for permission to use the company and seek permission for the final bid. It takes time. One step after another.


