

How we're praying on Hallow: Lent Pray40: The Way.

This program is a short session to listen to each day of lent. There are inspiring stories, challenges of faith, and guided prayers-- each day is different. It is voiced by different people every day: Jonathan Roumie, Fr. Mike Schmitz, Sr. Miriam, Mark Wahlberg, Chris Pratt, Cardinal Sarah and many, many more! The goal is to draw closer to Jesus who is "the way, the truth, and the life." It is not too late to start!

How to get on Hallow: go to Hallow.com/parish or scan the QR code at our Churches and searching for your parish name in the search box. 2. Select your parish and hit "Continue". Requires registering by selecting one of four methods: phone, email, Google, or Apple to create your account. (It will show an option for the \$1 offer below at this point.) 3. Next you will need to download the Hallow App, open and create a login password. Once done, you can start using the App. The 40 day Lenten prayer challenge is in the "Community" section of the App. There is an Optional 3 month Hallow App trial subscription for \$1.

What we're watching this week on Formed: Mysteries of the Rosary.

This is a captivating series filmed in the Holy Land that walks you through the awesome power of the Rosary. There are two seasons, one about the sorrowful mysteries and one about the joyful mysteries. Each episode dives into a mystery, filmed at the actual location! This series is so captivating and inspiring, the stories of faith will leave you speechless. **How to get on Formed:** You can download it as an app on your phone or on your smart TV, just like you would Netflix. To create an account, go to www.formed.org/signup Enter "Hancock County Catholic Churches", Follow the directions, enter your name and email, then you have an account!

Two Days Our Priests Will Be With Bishop Tylka. Fr. James and Fr. Tony will be with Bishop Tylka and the priests of the diocese of Peoria for an Assembly Days gathering on Wednesday, March 26. There will not be Stations of the Cross and Mass at Dallas City on Wednesday, March 26. Also, on April 15, we will be with the Bishop and brother priests at the Chrism Mass, the Mass of Renewal of Priestly Promises and Blessing and Redistribution of the Holy Oils used for the Sacraments: on Tuesday, April 15. There will not be Mass at Hamilton on Tuesday, April 15. There will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament beginning at the usual time, 4 p.m.

Spanish Mass: Bypassing April, Awaiting May. Because the second Sunday of April is Palm Sunday, there will not be a Spanish Mass in April, in favor of the extended Confession times we have during Holy Week. But we'll be back again on the second Sunday in May - and we'll be celebrating First Communion Sunday!

A Lenten Reflection in Solidarity with Pope Francis Laudato Sl' Chapter 2 - The Gospel of Creation - March 22-23

Pope Francis uses Biblical Examples to show the "tremendous responsibility" of all humankind for creation as well as the connection among all. (LS95). While appreciating the benefits of technology, Pope Francis warns that it also gives humanity power which must be used wisely. Historically, the interaction between man and nature "has meant being in tune with and respecting the possibilities offered by" nature. But now, "by attempting to extract everything possible from" the earth, the relationship between man and creation "has become confrontational". "This has made it easy to accept the idea of infinite or unlimited growth, which proves so attractive to economists, financiers and experts in technology." This unlimited growth "is based upon the lie that there is an infinite supply of the earth's goods, and this leads to the planet being squeezed dry beyond every limit. It is a false notion that "an infinite quantity of energy and resources are available, that it's possible to renew them quickly, and that the negative effects of the exploitation of the natural order can be easily absorbed" (LS106).

As we journey through this sacred season of Lent, we invite you to join us for our Living Stations of the Cross, a special prayer experience led by our 5th and 6th grade students. Through Scripture, reflection, and reenactment, we will walk with Christ on His path to Calvary, deepening our faith and preparing our hearts for Easter. We hope you will come and share in this moving tradition as we reflect on Christ's ultimate sacrifice and love for us all. *Friday, March 28 at SPPS Gym, 5:00 p.m.*

Another Visit from the Holy Land, March 29/30. This time, the carved sacred objects available to us will have Easter as a theme. The way we get news, it's easy to forget - "out of sight, out of mind" - that Christians in the Holy Land need our support. Consider something like a Rosary, or some item affordable and worthy of offering monetary support. Might be a rather hectic weekend; we'll do our best this Lenten season to show our support. As you read this announcement, we're only a week away from Blest Art's visitation, next weekend. Please keep in mind that our current news has a tendency to jump from one crisis to another, without follow-up on the aftermath of an initial news shock. What happened in California after the wildfires were contained? The latest news on the war between Russia and Ukraine? And for us, next weekend: what is the plight of Christians in the Holy Land? Things are far from over in the Middle East. And our brothers and sisters in Christ are suffering from want of access to work, security in home life, and assurance of the very survival of faith in Jesus Christ - exactly where He chose to live among us! A suggestion: how about a deliberate Lenten sacrifice? Nothing extravagant. Just offer a financial gift for A Rosary, some small statue, or another religious item from the Holy Land. Take a look at what we will have done: prayer for our brothers and sisters in Christ; money offered to Blest Art instead of other personal use; therefore, the complete definition of a sacrifice. I realize that it gets a bit much, having two efforts such as this in the space of a single year. But compared to returning to a bombed-out area that used to be a home or hate stares and other displays of intolerance on the way to as simple a thing as going to church - this is something we can be willing to do. 
