Third Sunday of Lent

MARCH 23, 2025

Exodus 3:1-8a,13-15;

1 Corinthians 10:1-6,10-12; Luke 13:1-9

[There are alternate Biblical texts that may be used
 for the first and second readings.]

“Get with the program!” might sum up the
 theme of today’s Mass.

The first reading describes Moses’ encounter
 with the Lord in the burning bush. The Lord
 calls on Moses to return to Egypt to lead the
 Israelites out of slavery. Moses is an escaped
 felon. He has a good thing going. He has
 married well, and would be perfectly content
 to live the rest of his days in the land of Midian.

Here, and elsewhere, Moses puts up every
 possible objection as to why he should not
 return to Egypt. God reveals his name as “I
 AM” or “he who is, who was, and who will
 never cease to be.” This is the Hebrew word
 “Yahweh.” (So sacred is the Name that even
 today Jews will never pronounce it! We might
 well imitate their reverence!)

In the second reading, Paul draws an analogy
 for the Corinthians. They had grown smug
 and self-satisfied. They had been baptized. They
 had received the Holy Spirit. They had the
 Eucharist. Paul tells them that all this is
 worthless unless they show forth the good fruit
 of virtue — especially charity. He says that the
 Israelites in the desert were “baptized” in
 Moses (when they passed through the Red
 Sea); they had spiritual food and drink (water
 from the rock and manna); the cloud of God’s
 presence was with them.

But they were not pleasing to God! They were
 grippers, whiners, and rebels. It is an object
 lesson not only to the Corinthians but to us.
 (Jewish tradition said that the rock followed
 them throughout forty years’ wandering, and
 that they always had fresh water. Paul goes a
 step further and says the rock was Christ!)

The Gospel is not one of the best in the
 lectionary, but its meaning is clear: Some
 people think that catastrophes happen because
 of sins. Jesus uses some examples known to his
 hearers and says that they weren’t any worse
 sinners than other people.

All are called to bear good fruit. If a fruit tree
 doesn’t bear fruit, you prune it and fertilize it.
 If it still doesn’t bear fruit, you cut it down.
 This will be our lot unless we bear good fruit.
 Get with the program! Stop your whining and
 griping! Stop hesitating! Start bearing the
 good fruit of righteousness in the community

Catechesis on the Jubilee

THE JUBILEE LOGO

You may have seen this simple and beautiful logo of the 2025 Jubilee Year. Do you know what it means? As we can see, there are many symbols on the logo. Do you know their significance? On this catechesis on the jubilee logo, all these things shall be explained.

On the upper left of the logo is an inscription, “Jubilee 2025” in black. This inscription announces that what you are looking at is the logo of the 2025 ordinary Jubilee Year. The logo contains five symbols, all necessary for our faith: Four human-like figures, waves, anchor, cross and Jubilee motto.

The Figures: Clearly seen on the logo are four stylized figures in different colours of blue, green, yellow and red. They represent all of humanity, coming from the four corners of the earth. Note that they are not equal in size yet they have similar appearance. This depicts the nature of our world where diversity is the norm: various cultures, languages, peoples; differing sizes of population, geography, resources, different beliefs, attitudes, commitments etc. The figures embrace each other to indicate the solidarity and fraternity which should unite all peoples. The red figure at the front is holding onto the cross, the sign of our faith. Following the lead figure, they all cling to the cross, symbolizing our unfailing hope that God will not abandon us at the time of our greatest need.

The Waves: Beneath the figures are rough waves. This symbolizes that the pilgrimage of life does not always go smoothly in calm waters. Our day-to-day experiences are not always smooth and tranquil. For this, the circumstances of daily life and events in the wider world should be anchored in hope.

The Anchor: The lower part of the Cross is elongated turning into an anchor, which dominates the movement of the waves. The anchor is used often as a symbol of hope. In maritime jargon, as it is often expressed, the ‘anchor of hope’ refers to the reserve anchor used by vessels involved in emergency maneuvers to stabilize the ship during storms. Thus, in the ‘rough waves of life,’ we should anchor our hope in God. The figures on the rough waves facing the cross reminds us that the pilgrim’s journey is not individual, but rather communal, with the signs of a growing dynamism that moves more and more toward the Cross.

The Cross: The cross in the logo is not standing erect. Archbishop Rino Fisichella, the former president of the Pontifical Council for the New Evangelization explains why the cross is not erect: “The Cross is not static but dynamic, bending toward and meeting humanity as if not to leave it alone, but rather offering the certainty of its presence and the reassurance of hope.”

The Motto: At the bottom of the logo is the motto of the 2025 Jubilee Year: Peregrinantes in Spem (Pilgrims in hope), represented in green letters. Green is the colour of life and once there is life, there is hope and our hope is anchored in God.

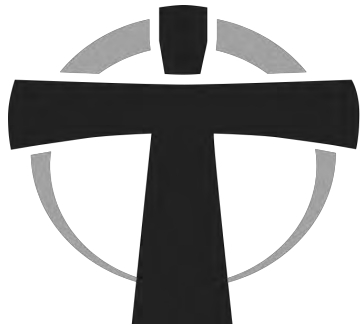
