Fourth Sunday of Lent

MARCH 30, 2025

Joshua 5:9a,10-12; 2 Corinthians 5:17-21;
 Luke 15:1-3,11-32

[There are alternate Biblical texts that may be used
 for the first and second readings.]

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is usually called “Laetare Sunday.” (It’s pronounced “lay-TAH-ray.”) It means “Rejoice!” It is the first word of the Latin Entrance Antiphon or Introit.

Why do we rejoice during Lent? Our Opening Prayer says that we rejoice in God’s word. Our first reading speaks of the joy of the Israelites as they finally entered the Promised Land. Our Responsorial Psalm tells us to look to the Lord that we may be radiant with joy. The second reading encourages us to rejoice because we are a new creation. At the end of the Gospel, the Father says that “we must celebrate and rejoice” because the lost is found, the dead has risen.

There are other reasons for joy: In the ancient Church, the Lenten fast (and every day was a fast day) did not begin until Monday after the Fourth Sunday of Lent. Today, then, was a kind of “Mardi Gras” — a day of rejoicing before the Lenten Fast. Still later in the history of the Church, people rejoiced because Lent is half finished; we are half way to Easter.

Our primary reason for rejoicing, however, must always be God’s unlimited and unconditional love of us. Even when we were God’s enemies because of sin, God loved us and sent his Son to save us. Even when we are weak and when we fail, the Lord still reaches out to us with his love and mercy — just as the Father in the parable.

Do you know of someone who is burdened with sin? Tell him/her of God’s love. Do you know of someone who thinks he/she is nothing and that life is worthless? Tell him/her that God loves him/her with an everlasting love. Do you think that you are so rotten that not even God can help you? Read the story of the “Prodigal Son” and learn the love of our heavenly Father. Rejoice! God loves you! He can heal you and make you a person of joy!

Fourth Sunday of Lent, March 30, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

It's hard to believe that this is the last weekend in our month of March. This month has sped by with Easter just around the corner. Hopefully with the month of April arriving, we will begin to experience Spring-like weather and be able to enjoy the outside activities.

As I introduced last week, on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent we celebrate what is called the Scrutinies at the 9:30 Mass. In the early Church, these scrutinies were a series of tests (knowledge and formation) for the Elect (those to be baptized). So at this Mass we will hear differing readings than the other Masses because the 9:30 Mass will center on the scrutinies for our Elect. This is why you will notice in our missalettes that there are two sets of readings for this weekend, Cycle A (9:30 Mass) and Cycle C (the other Sunday Masses). For the 9:30 Mass the scrutinies are no longer tests but prayers with the theme of the readings in all of the prayers. This week, the gospel is the man born blind. Jesus encounters a young man who was blind from birth. Because he was blind, this deformity was thought to be a result of sin. Jesus heals him from this deformity and now he is able to see. Because of his new sight, he begins to believe in Jesus and follows him. The people around him want to know from Jesus whose sin it was that caused his blindness. After much interrogation and seeking ways to arrest Jesus, Jesus reveals to those who could see how blind they were to Him. And so this gospel is perfect for this Sunday as we pray that our own Elect will always have that same vision of Jesus that the blind man had in this gospel. For those not present at the 9:30 Mass, you will hear the story of the Prodigal Son or what is often called the Merciful Father. Each of us can find ourselves in the position of both the younger son and the older son in some way throughout our lives. Both are in need of the Father's mercy. The only difficulty is that the younger son realized his need for that mercy whereas the older son did not. The older son basically expected it without recognizing a need in his life for it. I only hope that during the rest of Lent, each of us first, will realize how blind we are and how much we need God to help us see. And second, that all of us will make use of God's mercy and forgiveness during Lent by celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Lent. May God's mercy and forgiveness, always present for us, help us open ourselves to His mercy and may each of us find our need for forgiveness in all of our lives.

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is called Laetare Sunday. The word "Laetare" is a Latin Word which means to "rejoice." It is taken from Isaiah 66:10-11 which is the Entrance Antiphon for our Mass this day. This antiphon proclaims, "rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning, exult and be satisfied, at her consoling breast." We rejoice because God's grace allows us to see with eyes of faith, He heals us of our blindness, and He helps us see our sinfulness and in turn gives us His mercy and forgiveness. We truly rejoice in His abundant mercy. As a sign of our spirit of rejoicing the Church permits rose-colored vestments for our celebration this weekend. No it is not pink, but the color is rose. Let all of us rejoice for the Lord has done great things for all of us and His mercy and forgiveness are gifts open to all of us.

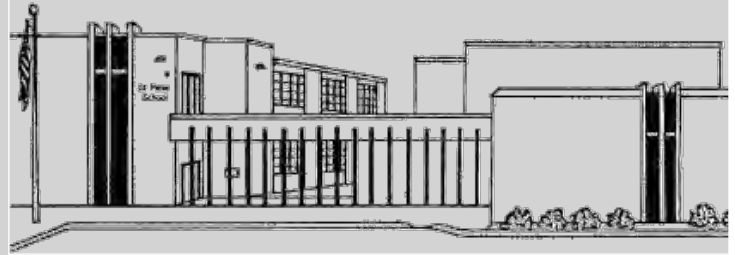
