

#### A Lenten Reflection in Solidarity with Pope Francis

"I wish to address every person living on this planet" (LS 3), writes Pope Francis in his encyclical *Laudato Si'*, on Care for our Common Home. The encyclical's name comes from St. Francis 'words, "Praise be to you, my Lord," in his *Canticle of the Creatures*. Pope Francis reminds us that the Earth, home to all of us, "is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us (LS 1)."

The Vatican acknowledges the commitment of many to ecological and social issues, emphasizing the vulnerability of those with fewer resources, "We have collectively understood that environmental stewardship is not just for specialists. Everyone has a role to play and the discernment and commitment of families, individual consumers, businesses, youth movements, schools, and local governments are fundamental."

This Lent the Peoria Diocesan Council of Catholic Women (PDCCW) invites you to consider your own role in care for the Earth. Pope Francis tells us, "All is not lost. Human beings, while capable of the worst, are also capable of rising above themselves, choosing again what is good, and making a new start" (LS 205). Accept the challenge to learn about what it means to you to care for the Earth. About the Issues of the Day. I have been grateful for a few wake-up calls, lately. The recent bout with illness was one, rather sobering, at that. And I have been approached about addressing Church teaching to the issues of the day in our nation. Our bishops - and our own Bishop Tylka - based on the Catechism of the Catholic Church, advise priests and deacons not to address these issues in such a way as to arouse suspicion or skepticism about alignment to the positions of political parties. It is the role of the laity to enter into the public discourse, the civic involvement, and the education/information necessary for our society to resolve these issues. We are called to address the Gospel to our nation and our world, for the sake of the salvation of souls. But issues so intertwined as those currently experienced, when separated, each have a basis in Scripture for their positions, with justification for the moral decision making involved in each. All the more reason to be engaged, especially with those with whom we know or suspect disagreement, and to listen to each other. Your priests will be speaking in this vein, following Pope Francis' lifelong admonition to remember that it's human beings that we're dealing with, when we deal with each other, and those in the world around us who find themselves in the middle of how to figure these things out. Be assured that your comments, criticisms, observations are most welcome. This all rises and falls on how we accept and see through disagreement. Whether it was the Samaritan woman, the man born blind, the parable of the Good Samaritan, or the Pharisees: Jesus engaged. We'll need to do that too. Welcome to the world of good people having different takes on things. Based on the Bible, at that. Let's show the world how it's done. Fr. T.

The Hallow App is a Catholic app that helps users pray and meditate. It includes guided prayers, Bible readings, and music. The Diocese of Peoria has partnered with Hallow for this Lenten season. This app is available for both Android and Apple phone users. More information on how to access and utilize the Hallow app can be found below. Hallow 40 Day Lent Parish Prayer Challenge: 1. Access by either scanning the QR code or going to this website: Hallow.com/parish and searching for your parish name in the search box. 2. Select your parish and hit "Continue". Requires registering by selecting one of four methods: phone, email, Google, or Apple to create your account. (It will show an option for the \$1 offer below at this point.) 3. Next you will need to download the Hallow App, open and create a login password. Once done, you can start using the App. The 40 day Lenten prayer challenge is in the "Community" section of the App. Finally: Optional 3 month Hallow App trial subscription for \$1. Requires entering a credit card for payment. (As Fr. Tony is typing this, he's considering the untold joy of retirement!)


