First Sunday of Lent MARCH 9, 2025

Deuteronomy 26:4-10; Romans 10:8-13; Luke 4:1-13

Originally, Lent was the final preparation time for baptism which (except in case of emergency) was ministered only in the Easter Vigil and only to adults. Nowadays, Lent is the time for our baptismal renewal.

By baptism, we became children of God, temples of the Holy Spirit, members of Christ's own living Body (the Church), sharers in the very life of God. By baptism, we entered into a covenant with God. We promised that we would be loyal to the Lord in every aspect of our lives. We promised to love others as Christ loves us, and to be perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect.

Very likely, most of us have failed to live up to our baptismal dignity and our baptismal commitment. Lent, then, is the time to renew. We began on Shrove Tuesday with a good Confession. On Ash Wednesday, we remembered that we are nothing – dust, and therefore we must not live for this world.

Today, we reflect that we, like our spiritual ancestors, are nobodies. Nevertheless, God called us to be a holy people. He brought us to the promised land of baptism. So we must return to him the first and best of our lives.

In the Gospel, we see that even Jesus was tempted. If we are loyal to Christ, we shall also be tempted. We are tempted to follow the ways of the world instead of the way of Christ. We need help. We need faith. We need renewal!

God promises that he will never permit us to be tempted beyond our strength to resist. But we must pray for faith and for grace. Let us make use of this wonderful Lenten season to be more fervent in prayer, more generous in works of charity, more eager in celebrating the mysteries of our salvation. Let us daily die to this world and to self, in order that we may rise to live in his glory.

Dear Parishioners,

This day we celebrate the First Sunday in our Season of Lent. For many of us, this season celebrated our reception of the Ashes on Ash Wednesday, when we heard the minister of the ashes say to us, "Remember that you are dust and unto dust you shall return;" or "Repent and Believe in the Gospel." Whichever prayer was used, both phrases reminded us that we are sinners, our lives are mortal, and we need a Savior. According to our ordo: "The annual Lenten season is a fitting time to climb the holy mountain of Easter; The Lenten season has a double character, namely, to prepare both catechumens and faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery. The catechumens (those preparing for baptism), both with the rite of election and the scrutinizes, and by catechesis, are prepared for the celebrations of the Christian initiations; the faithful, ever more attentive to the Word of God and prayer, prepare themselves by penance for the renewal of their baptismal promises."


Our opening prayer for Ash Wednesday: Grant Lord, that we may begin with holy fasting this campaign of Christian service, so that we may be armed with weapons of self-restraint. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever." May the words of this opening prayer ring true in each of our lives.

During this season of Lent, the Church invites us to a time of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. To help us engage in a more active prayer life, I invite our parishioners to celebrate the Eucharist more often. To assist us, we will be having an evening Mass every Monday and Wednesday of Lent at 6:30 p.m. Also, we will be celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation on each of those days during Lent from 5:45-6:15 p.m. Also, on Fridays, we will be celebrating the Stations of the Cross at 6:30 p.m. with Confessions once again to precede this devotion. As far as fasting is concerned, Fridays during Lent is a time of abstinence from meat and perhaps a time to abstain from in-between meals. This type of fasting might help us improve our health. But that's an individual choice as far as the in-between meals are concerned. Finally, there will be many opportunities for almsgiving throughout Lent as you will see with columns from our bishop concerning differing collections. But I do invite you to consider our sister parishes in Haiti with any sacrificial gifts during Lent. Whatever you do always do with thankful hearts.

Once again, I remind you that if you haven't turned in your commitment card for the annual QND fund-raiser, please do so at your earliest convenience. We always need to support QND so that our students will have access to Catholic education through their most formative years, namely, high school. Your support today will keep our Catholic high school viable and growing for all of our youth.

I invite you to pray for the team and candidates on TEC 249 that will be taking place at Quincy University North campus. This will be Fr. Paul's first TEC experience so please pray for him and the entire team. May the Holy Spirit inspire each of them so that they return to us having experienced the presence of the Lord in heir midst.


