Pastor's Letter

March 9, 2025—1st Sunday of Lent

Dear Church Family,

One of Pam and my favorite TV shows is Finding Your Roots. In each episode two famous people learn about their family histories, sometimes going back many centuries. It's very interesting to see the effect that hearing these family stories has on the show's guests. Very often they respond very emotionally, as if they just happened yesterday, not to someone who lived decades or even hundreds of years ago. And even though they may have never heard of these ancestors of theirs before going on the show, there is often a strong sense of connection.

In our first reading for today, Moses tells the people how to make an offering in thanksgiving to God when they make their first harvest in the Promised Land. When they bring the first fruits of the harvest to the Lord, they are to recite the story of their salvation from slavery. This remembering is intended to help them to maintain a sense of gratitude to God so that they know that everything they have is a gift from him. It is also meant to help them grow in trust of the Lord when they face difficulties in the present. God, who helped them so powerfully in the past is still with them today.

Knowing the salvation story as recorded in Holy Scripture is important to us for the same reasons. Even Jesus, when he faced temptations from the devil in the desert, turned to God's Word for guidance and strength. The Bible contains the wisdom and promises of our Creator. It tells the stories of our spiritual ancestors and how God helped them face the challenges and temptations of their lives and what happened when they did or did not listen to God.

What they went through is not so different from what we face today. We are still looking for answers to the same questions they asked: What is the good life? Why am I here? Where am I going? God has the answers for us and the church presents those answers to us in Scripture and Tradition.

In this season of Lent, we are invited to give our attention to these stories in a fresh way, to step outside the distractions of material pursuits through a season of intensified prayer and fasting so that we can really hear the story of our salvation and recommit ourselves to walking with God on the path that Jesus Christ has opened up for us by his life, death, and resurrection. May these forty days clear our minds, warm out hearts, refresh our souls and help us find our spiritual roots.

Lenten Obligation

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.



