Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday)

APRIL 13, 2025

Gospel of Palms: Luke 19:28-40. Mass: Isaiah 50:4-7; Philippians 2:6-11; Luke 22:14—23:56 or Luke 23:1-49

Holy Week is the great week of spiritual renewal. Today we begin our celebration of the "Paschal Mystery." "Paschal" means "Passover;" it also means "Easter." The "Paschal Mystery" is the mystery of sorrow and joy, of defeat and of victory. It is the strange paradox that we must deny ourselves if we are to find ourselves – that we must die in order to really live, that we must suffer in order to share in ultimate victory.

Jesus said, "Unless a seed falls into the ground and dies, it shall not live." He said, "He who would save his life will lose it." He said, "He who humbles himself will be exalted." These and other paradoxical statements are expressions of the "Paschal Mystery."

Jesus dedicates himself totally to the will of the Father. In doing this, he encounters suffering and death. Through his obedience and humility in his suffering and death, he gains the victory of the resurrection.

It is the same with us: We must deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow him in every aspect of our lives if we are to find real life. This week's liturgies will be filled with the paradox of the Paschal Mystery: Defeat and Victory will be intertwined, often in the same celebration.

Today, we wave palm branches of acclamation and victory; the liturgical color is festive red instead of Lenten violet. Yet the Scripture readings are of the Suffering Servant, the Son who emptied himself and became obedient unto death, and the Gospel of the Passion according to St. Luke.

Don't let anything interfere with your spiritual renewal this week. All shopping and activity should be completed before Good Friday. The time from Holy Thursday evening until the Easter Vigil should be a time of quiet and reflection with no games or parties or entertainments. Be sure to share in the liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday; do this even if you have done nothing else during Lent.

Dear Parishioners.

Today is Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week. Jesus enters into the city of Jerusalem. "As He rode along, people were spreading their cloaks on the road; and now as He was approaching the slope of the Mount of Olives, the hole multitude of His disciples began to praise God aloud with joy for all the mighty deeds they had seen. They proclaimed: 'Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord. Peace in heaven and glory in the highest.'" As we celebrate this holiest of weeks, I invite you to our differing celebrations, especially what is called the Triduum.

This Tuesday, the priests of the diocese are expected to attend the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral. It is within this Mass that the priests renews his vows and the bishop will bless the three holy oils, namely, chrism, the oil of the sick, and the oil of catechumen. After this Mass, each parish represented will bring to the parish these oils to be used throughout the year. I ask your prayers for your priests of your parish and the priests of our diocese.

As our Lenten season comes to an end, there will be differing opportunities this week to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession). This Sunday, April 13, there will be an all city wide Reconciliation Service celebrated at St. Anthony Church at 3:00 p.m. There will be a number of differing priests available for confession so I encourage you to celebrate confession at this time.

The following is the Triduum schedule for this week. Please join us at these very moving liturgies and celebrate the Lord's passion, suffering, and death.

Holy Thursday: April 17, Mass of the Lord's Last Supper, 7:00 p.m.

Confessional times: 11:00-Noon, and 3:00-5:00 p.m.

As is our custom, we will be having adoration times after the evening service. In order that each time slot be covered, we are asking if able that last names of families beginning with the letters indicated cover the times: 8:00 A-I, and Saints Alive; 9:00 J-Q and Found; 10:00 R-Z, and any high school or college students. In the Passion Jesus enters the Mount of Olives and says to the apostles with Him, "Pray that you might not undergo the test." Jesus is asking the same to us. Let's stand watch and pray with Jesus.

Good Friday: April 18, Celebration of the Lord's Passion, 7:00 p.m.

Confessional times: 11:00-Noon, and 4:00-6:00 p.m.

We will also be celebrating Stations of the Cross at 3:00 p.m.

Holy Saturday: April 19, the Easter Vigil, 8:00 p.m.


