Acts 10:34a,37-43;

Colossians 3:1-4 (or 1 Corinthians 5:6b-8);

John 20:1-9 (or Luke 24:1-12)

In all Masses of Easter, we renew our baptismal promises. Most of us were too young to remember our baptism; our sponsors and parents made the promises for us. But we must "ratify" those vows if we are to be Christians. We promised to renounce Satan and all his attractions; we promised to be loyal to Jesus Christ.

What does it mean to you to be a Catholic Christian? Do you just "go through the motions," or does Jesus Christ make a difference in your life at every moment? If Jesus Christ did not rise from the dead, then the Church is a fraud and faith is a sham. But if he really did rise from the dead, his message is true! And if it is true, then you must follow him with all your heart and soul and strength and mind.

On Palm Sunday, the New Testament reading (Philippians 2:6) told us that our attitude must always be that of Christ. Don't be a hypocrite; don't be two-faced: If you say you are Catholic, then be one. If you don't want to practice it, don't pretend!

To be Catholic means some tough decisions in this world. It means absolute honesty. It means carrying our crosses joyfully, whatever they be. It means having hope even when things seem hopeless. It means doing the best we can, and putting our complete trust in the Lord.

To follow Christ means purity of heart and body. It means that we use our sexuality only in the context of marriage. It means the moderation of all our appetites and desires, using them only as God intends them. It means standing up for what is true and right, even when we are opposed and laughed at.

If some of these things seem hard, realize that it is liberating to follow Christ! He frees us from entanglements which drag us to destruction. He gives us absolute joy and eternal happiness, for he has conquered death by his resurrection!

The first reading is a sermon of Peter to Cornelius. He tells the story of Jesus, concluding with the death and resurrection of the Lord. The second reading (Colossians) tells us that we should be concerned about the things of heaven, since (in our baptism) we have been raised with Christ. The alternative second reading tells us that we should live a "Passover" being a pure dough in Christ who was sacrificed for us.

The Gospel translation may not convey the full impact of the words "wappings on the ground." In the original language, the words mean "wappings laying in their folds." The idea is that the wrappings still had the contour of the body of Jesus even though the body was not there. It was as if the body had evaporated! The only explanation can be that he had risen from the dead. (Otherwise, the wrappings would show wrinkles, or would show that someone had snatched the body away.) Christ has risen! Let us be loyal to him.

From Father Arisman :

He is Risen! No not me, although kind of! It has been a wild ride. Jesus Christ is Risen from the Dead! Happy Easter!

Do we really understand what this means for each of us who give our hearts and lives to him? This is our salvation.

Jesus died and rose from the dead so that we too may follow where He goes, into death, but our hope is that we too will rise with Him. This is profoundly good news. They found the tomb empty but did not yet understand the Scripture saying He had to rise from the dead. So often we do not either. Death is nothing to fear when we have Jesus.

As we hope for the resurrection for our loved ones, we are also reminded as Catholics that we believe that heaven is not far away. As we come to Mass, we come to the gates of heaven, we glimpse into that eternity.

Every Mass, every Sunday is an Easter. May we peer into the tomb with Peter and the other disciples and see our hope. Happy Easter to you and all you love. If you are traveling, be safe. If you are gathering with your loved ones, enjoy! If you are celebrating in any other way, remember the real celebration is as this family, the Church.

I miss you all so very much. Your cards, letters, gifts, and generosity have kept me going through this recovery. You all have reminded me of how loved I am. You have meant the world to me. I wish I could keep up with writing back to people, but the recovery is a lot. I cannot wait to return, but I also have no idea when. Keep praying for me, I need you. I love you all! Know of my prayers for you all. Happy Easter! Truly He is risen!
