2nd Sunday of Easter (Sunday of Divine Mercy)

APRIL 27, 2025

Acts 5:12-16; Revelation 1:9-11a,12-13,17-19; John 20:19-31

Recall that for several centuries, the usual practice of the Church was to baptize adults only (unless infants and children were in danger of death). Adults were baptized only in the Easter Vigil, after they had completed an intensive two-year Catechumenate. This practice lasted from the third through the seventh century.

At their baptism, the newly-baptized were given a white robe. The neophytes came to Mass each day after Easter where they were given intensive instructions in the sacramental life. They wore these white robes until today. On this day, they put aside the white robes and took their place as full-fledged members of the Church. (This is the reason that this Sunday formerly was called *White Sunday* from the Latin for *The Sunday for Putting Aside the White Garments*.)

We might see today's Scripture readings in the context of this "Mystagogic Catechesis" (the final instructions in the sacraments) of the newly baptized. Today's lesson would be on the Sacrament of Reconciliation. All of us should be saints. We should be so conscious of our baptismal dignity that we would never stoop to sin.

But suppose we fail? The Lord gives us the Sacrament of Reconciliation or Penance. It is the Sacrament of his merciful forgiveness. It is, as it were, *second baptism*. On Easter Sunday night, Jesus gave his apostles the power to forgive sins. Catholics should memorize John 20:22-23 which occurs in today's Gospel: "Whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven..."

Who can forgive sins except God? Only those to whom the Lord gives the power. But Jesus told his apostles that they would do even greater works than he had done (John 14:12). The apostles show the power of Christ in the first reading. They and their successors will show even greater power in the Sacrament of Christ's mercy, Reconciliation.

If we say that we believe in this sacrament, then let us use it! This sacrament is not only for the forgiveness of serious sin; it is the means of our growth in holiness. Frequent Confession should be part of the life of every active Catholic.

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday we are celebrating the feast of Divine Mercy Sunday. You may ask yourself why Divine Mercy Sunday? On April 30, 2000, Pope St. John Paul II canonized a Polish nun by the name of Faustina Kowalski who had visions and conversations with Jesus during the 1930's. At the age of 18, she left home to go to Warsaw to join the Convent. After two years she was accepted into the congregation of sisters of Our Lady of Mercy. In 1931, she had a vision of Jesus in a white robe with red and pale rays emanating from His heart. You may have seen a painting, or a picture of Jesus based on the vision given to St. Faustina. In the picture or painting, it shows Jesus raising His right hand in a gesture of blessing, with His left hand on His heart from the gush of two rays, one red and one white. The picture or painting has a message, "Jesus I Trust in You."

The red ray symbolizes the blood of Jesus, which is the life-giving source of salvation and forgiveness. It is also associated with the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Eucharist.

The white ray represents the water that flowed from Jesus' side, which is associated with baptism, repentance, and the purification of souls. It also signifies the grace that God pours out to those who trust in His mercy. At the canonization of St. Faustina, Saint John Paul II said, "Believing in the love of God means believing in His mercy... St Faustina invites us by the witness of her life to keep our faith and hope fixed on God the Father, rich in mercy, who saved us by the precious Blood of His Son our Lord Jesus Christ." St. John Paul II, in canonizing St. Faustina, he designated the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday and officially made it part of the church's liturgical calendar. He re-emphasized the message of the feast: "Humanity will never find peace until it turns with trust to Divine Mercy. Divine Mercy! This is the Easter gift that the church receives from the risen Christ and offers to humanity." Devotion to Divine Mercy has grown rapidly over the past few years. We live in a culture that would rather attack and blame others than forgive and show mercy.

On this Divine Mercy Sunday, we are invited to celebrate the boundless Mercy of God. We are called to be a vessel of mercy, extending grace and forgiveness to others as we have received it ourselves. In our Gospel today we are reminded of how Jesus instituted the sacrament of Reconciliation, Sacrament of Divine Mercy. The risen Lord gave the apostle and their successors the power to forgive sins with the words: "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven, and whose sins you retain are retained" and the second part of the Gospel present us with doubting Thomas' famous profession of Faith, "My Lord and My God." Jesus shows mercy to doubting apostles and emphasizes the importance of faith and trust in Jesus. As we celebrate the Divine Mercy Sunday, we are invited to put our trust and have Faith in God's divine mercy in our daily life by practicing corporal works of mercy and receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation. Let us all entrust our worries, doubts, and cares to the Divine Mercy of God by saying "Jesus, I Trust in You" and make a profession of Faith like the Apostle Thomas, "My Lord and My God."


Fr. Paul's column continued..

In summary, when the Pope passes into eternity, there are a series of Rites and traditions that govern the period known as "Sede Vacante" "the Seat is Vacant" the Catholic Church enter a period of Mourning, Papal funeral and the Conclave, a process for electing a new Pope.

Haiti Sister Parish Update

While the country of Haiti remains chaotic and challenges abound, Fr. Michel remains positive and continues to daily serve God and his people. In addition to offering Mass at Our Lady of the Assumption and his two mountain churches - St. Leo the Great and St. John the Baptist, he oversees and supports two student groups and provides food for his people. Most recently he prepared 32 parishioners for baptism at Easter.

After several St. Peter parishioners expressed an interest in becoming an education sponsor, we approached Fr. Michel about increasing the number of eligible students. He agreed. Although this additional responsibility falls upon his shoulders, he recognizes that education is the only way to raise his people from poverty. Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, we will increase the number of students from 29 to 35. Due to rampant inflation in Haiti we will also raise the cost of a sponsorship from \$325 to \$350. This is the first increase since the inception of our education program. If you are interested in becoming a sponsor, contact Kim Venvertloh (217-779-4678) for further information.






