Fifth Sunday of Lent

APRIL 6, 2025

Isaiah 43:16-21; Philippians 3:8-14;
John 8:1-11

During the last two weeks of Lent, we reflect on the suffering and death of Jesus. In ancient times, crosses were very ornate and beautiful; usually the crosses did not display the body of Christ. The empty cross was a symbol of Christ's victory in the resurrection.

For this reason, the Church veiled the crosses during the time when we meditate on the suffering and death of the Lord. This was also the reason for veiling the statues: At this time, we do not think of the saints; we think of the Passion and Death of the Lord.

Today's Mass, however, looks to the *effect* of Christ's Passion rather than to the suffering itself. By his Passion, the Lord atoned for all our sins! He redeemed us and brought us forgiveness.

The setting of the first reading is the return of the Jews from Babylonian Captivity in 538 B.C. Deutero-Isaiah compares this release to the liberation of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. Then the Lord brought them through the waters of the Red Sea to the Promised Land. Isaiah speaks of the waters in the desert and rivers in the wasteland. We naturally think of the waters of baptism in which we were baptized and liberated from sin.

In the second reading, St. Paul tells us of our new value system: In Christ, we now think of everything else as garbage. Compared with the glory of salvation, all other things are worthless. We are willing to share the suffering of Christ in order that we shall also share the glory of his resurrection.

The Gospel is the story of the woman caught in the act of adultery. The Torah called for her execution. Jesus' reply to the Scribes and Pharisees should be our motto: "Let the person without sin cast the first stone!" Although she did not deserve it, the Lord gently and respectfully forgives her and sends her on her way, telling her to sin no more.

Let us rejoice in the effect of Christ's suffering: our forgiveness! The Lord has done great things for us; let us be glad – and

Fifth Sunday of Lent, April 6, 2025


Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, the Church celebrates the Fifth Sunday of Lent. On this Sunday, the third and final scrutiny will be celebrated at the 9:30 a.m. Mass. Again, with the celebration of the third scrutiny, we use the Cycle A readings. And our cycle A readings have the theme of death and resurrection. We find an interesting first reading from Ezekiel the prophet. The prophet writes: “O my people, I will open your graves and have you rise from them, and bring you back to the land of Israel. Then you shall know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves and have you rise from them.” Then following this first reading, we have the gospel of John. In this gospel, Jesus enters the realm of the dead, to tomb of his friend, Lazarus. Lazarus had died and the loss was too much for Jesus as the gospel tells us that Jesus wept. When Jesus goes to the tomb He tells them to take away the stone. Many of the mourners who were present tried to prevent this opening for they were afraid of the stench. Regardless, Jesus after a brief prayer, says loudly, “Lazarus come out.” And Lazarus comes out bound with burial cloths and Jesus states, “Untie him and let him go.” This particular gospel is relevant as a scrutiny for those who are baptized are like Lazarus, wrapped in their old way of life, and through baptism, are freed to live the new life of Christ. Perhaps all of us can find ourselves wrapped in the old ways of sin only to hear the words of Jesus say to us, “untie yourselves, and come out.” Live the new life of grace in and through our baptisms.

Our second set of readings are from cycle C. Our first reading is from Isaiah the prophet. In this particular reading, we hear how God protected the people of Israel from the Egyptians who were pursuing them in the desert. God ends up destroying Israel’s enemy and now promises to give life in its newness. Our gospel for this cycle of readings is the gospel of the woman caught in the act of adultery. They bring her forward awaiting Jesus’ condemnation. Instead what we hear is Jesus asking a question of those so willing to condemn. “Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.” In response, the people all left. Then Jesus turns to the woman and asks, “woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?” She responds, “No one, sir.” Then we hear the words of forgiveness and reconciliation, “Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more.” This story of the woman caught in sin is the story of all of us. Our humanity reveals a side of ourselves, so often willing to condemn others, but not always willing to look at our own sinfulness. May each of us use the rest of Lent to see our own sinfulness and then be prepared to meet Jesus who says, “neither do I condemn you. Go, from now on do not sin any more.” One will never hear more beautiful words than these toward this woman and toward each of us.

This weekend we will have with us speakers who will be addressing us with regard to the Everybody Wins mega raffle sponsored by the Quincy Catholic Elementary Schools and the Quincy Notre Dame foundation. I ask you to listen to their message and be open to purchasing some raffle tickets. This particular raffle assists our young people in Quincy as they pursue a Catholic Educational experience from pre-school through high school.




