

But beyond the headlines and hashtags, the real story of Carlo is something deeper, something the world desperately needs to hear. Known for his deep love of God, devotion to the Eucharist, and quiet acts of charity, Carlo's life was a testament to everyday holiness.

May the life lessons of faith, family, and community go with our graduates as they advance into their futures.

Time for Focus, Part II. I have been a major offender myself: hanging on to the way things have been the past twenty-two years here, while our Bishop - our ultimate authority as successor of the Apostles - has made clear that the entire diocese is moving in a new direction. My Holy Week sermons must have sounded strange to some; advising people to adjust their way of thinking, when I myself had not yet made the adjustment. But it's time: even if we can't do it quickly, let's dispose ourselves to making peace with the past, as well as the future. Here's an edited version of the message of Palm Sunday: "The new thing...means entering into a type of crucifixion...an unfair, unmerited loss transformed by becoming a willing sacrifice....Transform this time into a willing act of faith, that, even if it's at a cost to us, there's something new to come from it, for the good of our Parish....Imagine Jesus saying to us: 'There's a resurrected future for generations yet to be born, but it's going to take the intrigue of an unjust death to do it. I need you on this cross, with me. I need you to take something forced upon you and turn it into a willing sacrifice. That's what I did, beginning on Palm Sunday.''' Remember, everyone, please: what has happened to two of our churches, has happened to all of us. And how we conduct and carry ourselves into the future, will determine what happens...to all of us.
