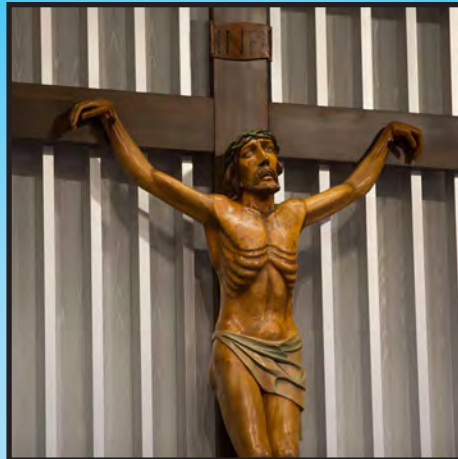

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

As I write today (Wednesday), the cardinals are just now entering the conclave to elect a new pope. The Church throughout the world prays for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit to help us discern and unite behind a shepherd who will witness to the resurrection and lead us after the heart of Christ.

As I said at Masses last weekend, the election of a pope is not something that shows up in Sacred Scripture. There are no prescriptions for white-smoking chimneys, no ceremony for a conclave, no formula announcing the new pope, *habemus papam*, nor many of the other particulars of

pageantry and tradition that we are witnessing over these days. But the Acts of the Apostles (1:15ff) does recount how the apostles quickly... urgently... gathered after the Ascension of Jesus, to call upon the Lord to show them who would replace Judas as the twelfth apostle. Perhaps it would have been convenient and timely for the Lord, while still walking among his apostles, to settle this question himself and to make that selection personally, but the fact that Jesus did not make the selection at this point, I think, shows us that the Lord intended to show his Apostles the new way he would guide the Church after his Ascension. We observe that the Church dares to assume the ability and responsibility for propagating its mission across space and time, that the Apostolic witness would not die with the apostles themselves, but that successors would be provided through prayer and the discernment of divine assistance. Acts further tells us that the two main qualifications were that the man be "with us the whole time the Lord Jesus was living among us," and that they must "become with us a witness of his resurrection". From the two identified as candidates, the apostles asked the Lord to show who they should select. The lot fell to Matthias. We do not hear anything more of Matthias from canonical scripture, but tradition suggests that he travelled in Africa and may have been stoned in Jerusalem later on in the first century. St. Helena, the Empress and mother of Constantine, is said to have located and translated the relics of St. Matthias from east to shrines in Padua, Italy and most notably Trier, Germany where an ossuary is on public display for veneration of the faithful today.

The election of a pope, along with the selection of other bishops, the ordination of priests and deacons, and the discernment of the many other charisms and ministries in the life of the Church reminds us that the Holy Spirit remains active in the Church, providing more than a mere administrative structure for preaching the Gospel or a simply providing for organizational succession. In every age, the Holy Spirit calls the baptized faithful to witness to the power of Christ alive among us, guiding and forming his flock as disciples and witnesses to the kingdom through the glory of the resurrection.

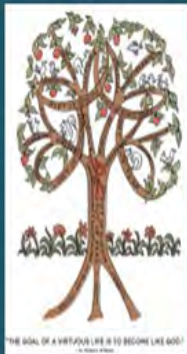


A Message from Mrs. Carol Frericks—Principal
