MAY 11, 2025 Acts 13:14,43-52; Revelation 7:9,14b-17; John 10:27-30

The Fourth Sunday of the Easter season is usually called "Good Shepherd Sunday." Read the entire tenth chapter of John for a fuller explanation of the Good Shepherd.

In the ancient Middle East, the king was often called the shepherd of his people. But for the Hebrews, only God could be the true shepherd, as Psalm 23 says. We are not sheep of an earthly monarch, but of the Lord himself. We must always follow God rather than people.

In John 10, Jesus calls himself the Good Shepherd; thus he identifies himself as the Lord. He feeds us and protects us and leads us. But he does more: He lays down his life for his sheep.

The second reading alludes to the fact that the Good Shepherd has laid down his life for his sheep. In the Middle East, sheep were usually kept for wool and for milk, and not for meat.

Shepherds became very attached to their sheep; they gave them names (as we name our pets). The sheep would follow only the voice of their own shepherd (just as our pets usually respond only to our voice).

The word "pastor" means "shepherd." Let us pray that many young men of this parish may respond to the call of the Good Shepherd to share in the ministry of shepherding the flock of Christ.

Fourth Sunday of Easter, May 11, 2025

Dear Parishioners,


On this second weekend in the month of May, the Church celebrates the 4th Sunday of Easter. This Sunday always provides us with the imagery of the Son of God as the Good Shepherd. In our particular reading, there is an emphasis on the "voice" of the Shepherd. In this gospel, Jesus says, "My sheep hear my voce; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish. It's rather interesting how we are called to be attentive to the voice of the Good Shepherd. This attentiveness illustrates that we belong to Him and He is the source of everything good in our lives. May each of us always recognize the one voice that leads to happiness and life eternal. So often you and I are bombarded with differing voices, telling us how to lose weight, or how to be successful, how to find happiness. Except the one true voice that leads us to life eternal, we all seem to ignore, which is that of the voice of the Good Shepherd. In this age of social media, let's never forget that the one voice in which we need to be intimate is the voice of the Good Shepherd who tells us over and over, "I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish." May each of us be open to that voice which provides everything that we need in life and in life eternal.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This May, our diocese will take up a collection for the Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC). Please prayerfully consider supporting the collection this year. Fifty percent of collected funds stay in the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois and the other 50 percent support communications projects in the United States and around the world.

Through Catholic Times, social media, videos, podcasting, and other digital methods, our diocese is taking advantage of several communication outlets to spread the news of our diocese, teach the faith, and provide hope and encouragement to people no matter where they are in their faith life.

Followers on the diocesan social media channels have exploded over the years. Our channels have far more followers than most dioceses our size, and several that are two to three times as big as our diocese and several archdioceses. For example, our Facebook page has nearly 12,000 followers (we had about 3,000 followers six years ago). In 2020, our YouTube channel had under 500 subscribers. Today, it is approaching 18,000 subscribers! This shows that the content our curia team is producing is engaging, inspirational, and educational, and people want to consume it because it is helping them.

For example, a search on YouTube for "How to go to Confession," has a video from our diocese in the top five for answering that question, with more than 165,000 views. Dive Deep, the official podcast of the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois, has listeners all over the world, and was endorsed by EWTN which placed Dive Deep on their podcast central webpage. God is Alive, Part 2, a documentary produced by our communications team that features incredible stories in the Midwest, premiered this spring to wide praise. The documentary comes on the heels of the popular God is Alive (part 1) documentary, which came out two years ago.

With your generosity, we can continue creating engaging content and bring people closer to our faith or even back to our faith.
