Acts 14:21-27; Revelation 21:1-5a; John 13:31-33a,34-35

Times change. Personnel come and go. We pass from one phase of life to another. This weekend, many will graduate from college; they will then go on to something new in life. This summer, many priests will receive changes of assignment; both priests and people must adjust.

Today's first reading describes a change in the Churches of Asia Minor. Paul is going to leave; they probably won't see him again. He ordains priests there, and commends them to God's care.

We can't hang on to the old forever. Parents must let go of their children. Teachers must let go of their students. We must all have faith and hope that God will always be with us.

The second reading tells of another change: John sees a new heaven and a new earth. The old had passed away. There might be nostalgia for the old and the comfortable, but the new will be better. We of the older generation must trust that the younger generation will have wisdom and insight and divine guidance as they face a new world.

The Gospel selection is Jesus' last instructions to his disciples. The big change would happen soon: He would return to his Father through his death, resurrection, and ascension. Before he leaves, he gives us a new commandment. The new commandment is the moral imperative of every Christian. We are called to love each other as Christ Jesus has loved us!

With the power of God's spirit, let us always strive to do this. Then each day will be new and vibrant. Then we shall have peace of soul even in crisis and adversity. Then we shall see that God is with us, and that all will be well.

Dear Parishioners,


It is hard to believe that we have less that a week of school remaining. Summer vacation is coming and our weather and the mood of our students seem to reflect this reality. I'm not sure where Spring went but it seemingly has come and gone. Summer is in our midst and our temperatures seem to be the indicator of this change of season. Our last day of school will be Wednesday May 21. But I caution our young people that even though they are on summer vacation, there is no such thing as a vacation from our faith and living that faith. So I am expecting to see our families present each and every weekend to celebrate our Eucharist together.

This weekend we are celebrating the Fifth Sunday in our season of Easter. After the resurrection, we find Paul and Barnabas teaching and preaching the good news, making a considerable number of more disciples for Jesus and His Way. One of the messages that they preached was very short and simple and endeavored to attract more and more people. This message found in our gospel simply stated the statement of Jesus when He said, "I give you a new commandment; love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." Wow! Those words of Jesus are so very profound yet simple. The message was not an intense study of theology but rather a challenge for all disciples to make a difference in the world through their love for Jesus and each other. What would happen if those words became reality for all of us? I think we would literally change our world.

I was thinking to myself that those words of Jesus would be valid for any graduation/promotion ceremony. And to our 8th graders, our graduates from QND and QHS, and our graduates of any college and university, let these words of Jesus ring true in your lives. "I give you a new commandment; love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." These words are a lasting remembrance and should be reflected in our lives. Once again, on behalf of our parish of St. Peter, I congratulate all of our graduates from QND and QHS, as both schools celebrate their graduation this weekend.

For the past several years, some of our parishioners have shared their stewardship of treasure by sponsoring some young people in Haiti in their quest to overcome their poverty through education. Not all education in Haiti is rewarding and this gives some of their young people a chance to attend private/Catholic schools. We have sponsored 29 students for the past several years. Now Fr. Michel is requesting to have our parish sponsor 35 students, an increase of 6 from previous years. So far we have had parishioners volunteer to sponsor two more, so we are still looking to fulfill the need of four more. The cost is \$350 but our sponsorship is a way of helping the young people of our sister parishes to overcome their poverty through a proper education. If you can help or would like to share your stewardship of treasure, please call the rectory and we will explain the procedure. To all those who have given in the past and to those new, I thank you!






