Sixth Sunday of Easter

MAY 25, 2025

Acts 15:1-2,22-29; Revelation 21:10-14,22-23; John 14:23-29

Jesus Christ did not leave us orphans when he ascended into heaven. He promised the Holy Spirit who would guide the Church and confirm her in the truth. Our Gospel tells of his promise of the Spirit: The Spirit would call to mind everything that Jesus had taught; he would instruct the Church in everything. He also told us that anyone who loved him would be true to his word.

We know the word of Jesus through the Church, which is protected from teaching error by the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus did not solve all problems or give his instructions in minute detail. Nevertheless, everything that is taught by the Church throughout the centuries comes integrally from the "deposit of faith" which Jesus imparted to the Spirit.

Jesus did not solve the question of the relationship of Jews and Gentiles in the Church. Did a person need to become a Jew before being a Christian? Were the non-Jews even invited to share salvation? Did Jewish Christians still need to follow the Law of Moses? These and many other questions were solved by the Church some years after Jesus had ascended to heaven. They were solved by the Church guided by the Holy Spirit.

Today's first reading tells us of the council of apostles at Jerusalem who determined that Gentile converts do not need to practice the Law of Moses. The Church is still developing and growing and understanding the teaching of Jesus more perfectly.

The Spirit gives the Church the charism of infallibility. The Church cannot teach error on matters of faith and morals. The chief agencies of this infallibility are the pope when he speaks "ex cathedra" at an Ecumenical or General Council.

Even though we do not see Jesus with eyes of body, we are confident that he guides the Church through the power of the Holy Spirit. He is with us. Let us be faithful to him and to his teaching.

Sixth Sunday of Easter, May 25, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

We gather this weekend to celebrate the Sixth Sunday of Easter. In our gospel today Jesus is forming His disciples in an awareness of His physical departure, encouraging them to open their hearts for the works of the Holy Spirit. Jesus wants His disciples to know that even though He is leaving them, that God will always be present with them through His gift of the Holy Spirit. This was so evident recently in the election of Pope Leo XIV. To think that the Cardinals of the world would gather in conclave and then elect the new Pope indicates that the Holy Spirit is still abiding in His Church, guiding and directing it. After watching the ceremonies on television, one just felt that the Holy Spirit was still directing the Church of Jesus founded upon Peter. God has never abandoned His Church and this was so evident once again in the election of our new Pope. All I can say is "thanks be to God" for His presence through the gift of the Holy Spirit. It also seems so obvious in our first reading from the Acts of the Apostles. In this reading, we find a problem in the early Church that surfaced. Apparently, some thought that one had to involve themselves in the Mosaic practices if they were to be members of this Church. They ended up choosing representatives to send to the apostles to clarify the discussion. And what amazes me is their conclusion and how even the early Church knew that the Holy Spirit was a part of their lives. And so we find them with much confidence, stating "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us not to place on you any burden beyond these necessities, which they then laid out." But the point of this reading is how confident the early Church was that the decisions they would make in terms of practices and doctrines arose from the presence of the Holy Spirit in their lives as a Church. And this is the same Spirit alive and active today in our Church.

This Saturday, May 24, Bishop Paprocki will be ordaining two young men to the priesthood for our diocese through the imposition of hands. These young men will be Fr. Charles Delano, and Fr. Ryan Kehoe. I ask you to remember these young men in your prayers as they begin their service to the Church as newly ordained men.

This Monday, May 26, is Memorial Day. As is our custom here in Quincy, we will have our Mass at Calvary Cemetery at 9:00 a.m. Please bring your lawn chairs and/or blankets and join us for this customary celebration in which we remember those who have died and are buried in our cemeteries. It is good and right to remember our dead as our prayers continue to assist them on their journey home. If is rains or we are not able to have the Mass at the cemetery our celebration will be moved to St. Francis Solanus Church. Also, I remind you that during this celebration, we invite you to use your parish envelopes and to donate toward the maintenance and improvements of our cemeteries. Personally, I think our cemeteries are places which truly reflect the dignity that we have for all of our deceased. But we also know that to maintain and improve our cemeteries, we continue to need your generous support as we meet so many challenges ahead. Roads, planting of trees, and opening up new burial places all cost money and the funds received during the sale of graves, do not always meet these needs. So please consider using your parish envelopes and help us in this endeavor. Thanks!
