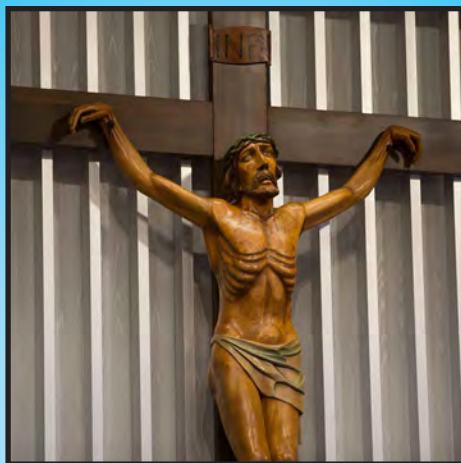

May 4, 2025 Third Sunday of Easter

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

Just two weeks ago, our churches were filled to capacity. Our families gathered in celebration. Our school students had a couple of days off before and after Easter and perhaps some of us had a day or two off of work. We called these days "holidays" because they were holy-days where we made special religious and social observances that broke the day-to-day routines of life. Only two weeks later though, and things have 'returned to normal'.

I think this is the tone that John sets in today's gospel (John 21: 1-19). The disciples were there to hear the announcement of an empty tomb, they witnessed Jesus as he told Thomas to put his hands in his hands and in his side, that he might believe. There are two other appearances recorded in the Gospel of John, and hints of others during these exciting weeks, but there apparently came a time when the prince of the apostles himself, Peter, returned to a 'normal life' and went back out to his job of fishing.

We hear the interaction today where Jesus called Peter once again. This story shares the same 'beats' of the prior stories in the scripture where Jesus invited Peter and his crew to "put out into the deep" for a great catch (Luke 5:4). After this experience, Jesus commissioned these fishermen to become "fishers of men" (Luke 5:10). Today Jesus fills the nets again and sends the prince of the apostles out on mission, fortified by the gift of his mercy and forgiveness following the betrayal of Peter that still loomed large from the days of the Lord's passion and death.

What difference does this encounter with Jesus make? Doesn't it make all the difference in the world? 'Returning to normal' for a Christian cannot simply be going back to one's old work and way of being, but Christ sends us out, on mission, to proclaim his goodness to a world that is darkened and hungry for truth and goodness. 'Mission' looms large in the Acts of the Apostles and the entire early history of the Church. Once we have encountered Christ, our lives can never be the same again!

What difference does this encounter with Jesus make? Doesn't it make all the difference in the world? 'Returning to normal' for a Christian cannot simply be going back to one's old work and way of being, but Christ sends us out, on mission, to proclaim his goodness to a world that is darkened and hungry for truth and goodness. 'Mission' looms large in the Acts of the Apostles and the entire early history of the Church. Once we have encountered Christ, our lives can never be the same again!



This week, ~133 cardinals will enter the conclave to elect the next successor to St. Peter. I recall a story told by Francis Cardinal George (1937-2015), as Archbishop of Chicago after the 2005 conclave that elected Joseph Ratzinger as Benedict XVI.

After the election of Benedict XVI and in the minutes before he would be introduced to the world, Cardinal George was standing in the front row of a flock of cardinals on one of the balconies. The video feed from Vatican News Service seemed to dwell on his pensive face. Francis George was a deeply thoughtful and insightful man, and so on his return to the United States, a question was put to him... what were you thinking about? Were they close to electing you pope? He laughed nervously, as being sworn to secrecy he could not tell the inner workings of the conclave, but when he pulled himself together he said, "you know, I was looking out over St. Peter's square and then down the Via Conciliatore," the road leading from the Tiber river in the east, up to St. Peter's. He said he could see all of the people pouring out of the buildings that crisp, sunny afternoon, to come to the square where several hundred thousand people had only weeks before witnessed the funeral of John Paul II and were now going to be introduced to a new shepherd.

He continued, "they were coming to see Peter". By that he meant, they were coming to see the successor of Peter... the one who stood in his shoes. The Caesars, praised and worshipped in ancient Rome, were long-gone. The Holy Roman Emperors were mere historical footnotes. Those who had conquered and looted Rome over the centuries have all passed away. But unlike all the others, the Peter's successor lives and can be seen. He teaches and preaches and evangelizes the Risen Christ. The cardinal not only witnessed and participated in an act of profound historical importance that afternoon, but he had participated in a work of the Holy Spirit to sustain the mission of the Son of God manifested by the Church—a mission entrusted to frail and weak men who are called to great feats, not through raw power, but through great faith. This week we are likely to see the beginning of the next chapter of this long, complicated history, where humanity cooperates and the Lord endows his people with his mercy and with his gifts.

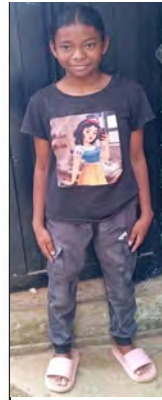

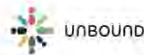
