When the captain and the court officers had brought the apostles in and made them stand before the Sanhedrin, the high priest questioned them, "We gave you strict orders, did we not, to stop teaching in that name? So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." He then said to Simon Peter a second time. "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." PRIMERA LECTURA HECHOS 5, 27B-32. 40B-41


