Third Sunday of Easter

MAY 4, 2025

Acts 5:27-32, 40b-41; Revelation 5:11-14;
John 21:1-19

The first reading tells us how the apostles were ordered not to speak of the name of Jesus again. They replied that they must obey God rather than people! They were flogged; then they counted it a joy to be worthy to suffer for Christ!

The second reading is taken from Revelation; this book was written to console those who were suffering persecution. Today's selection shows a scene in heaven. "The Lamb" may be identified with Jesus, who sacrificed his life for our salvation. After the ordeal of crucifixion, he is enthroned in glory. He is worthy to receive honor and glory because of his fidelity.

The thousands who surround the throne have been redeemed; they, too, are glorified because they were willing to give their lives for truth and for righteousness.

The Gospel tells of an appearance of the risen Christ in Galilee. The number 153 probably represents the entire world. (Ancient biologists enumerated a total of 153 species of fish.) Peter and the apostles are sent on a mission to "catch" the entire world for the Gospel of Christ. Peter is told that he will "stretch out his hands" (like a cross). Ancient tradition says that Peter was crucified upside down on Vatican hill in Rome.

The message of today's Mass, then, is that we must be loyal to truth and to virtue, even if it costs us dearly. Our loyalty must not be selective. It must be a loyalty to every aspect of the message of Jesus Christ.

For example, if we are opposed to the violence of abortion, we must also be opposed to violence in destroying property or in wounding or killing of any human being. If we are opposed to violence, we must control our tempers and our rhetoric.

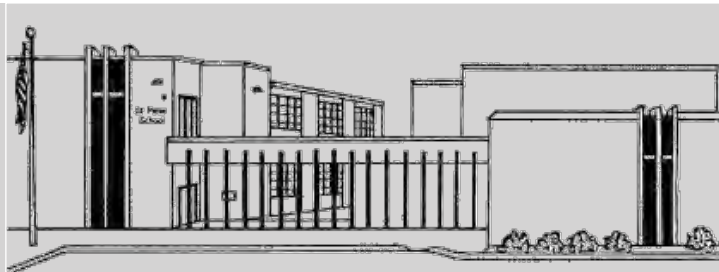
Dear Parishioners,

Well, guess who is back at his desk. After a week off to have a partial knee revision last week, I am back at my desk, trying to create another bulletin column for the weekend. Needless to say I am still undergoing physical therapy and for those who have experienced such an undertaking, you will understand what I mean when I say, “that hurts!” But I seem to be doing better and the people in charge say that I am recuperating quite well. I do want to thank you for your prayers, your cards, and the many treats that have come my way. All of these things help in my healing process. Not sure when I will be “back in the saddle again” since I am not able to drive for a while let alone move without the security of my walker. But I am pleased that I chose this surgery as I think it will be a benefit in the long run. Again, I thank all of you for your support and prayers. They mean a lot to me and will continue to assist in the healing process.

This weekend we gather to celebrate the Third Sunday of Easter. In our gospel for this weekend, we find the risen Christ appearing to His disciples only this time in the context of the apostles trying to normalize their activity by going fishing. After all the things that had happened to the apostles, the confusion of the resurrection, the differing appearances of the risen Lord to them and others, it is natural for them to engage in some activity in which there was certainty in life and in which they felt comfortable—and that was fishing. This activity was one that many of them left behind when Jesus called them and now they return to it as a way of occupying their minds and bodies. After all, the resurrection left them confused and uncertain. And as they returned to this previous occupation, they encountered the risen Christ. And it was in this encounter that we find Jesus centering his attention upon Peter. After denying Jesus three times, Jesus now gives Peter the opportunity to affirm Him three times. Jesus asks Peter, “do you love me more than these?” Peter responds, “yes, Lord, you know that I love you.” Then Jesus gives Him the mandate to “feed my lambs.” Since Peter denied knowing Jesus three times, Jesus would ask Peter “do you love me?” two more times to which Peter would respond, “yes, Lord, you know that I love you.” If we place ourselves in the shoes of this fisherman, we might feel as inadequate as he did in the midst of the risen Christ. Yet Christ was not going to let Peter off the hook but would instill confidence in Peter as he asked Peter to renew his love for Christ the number of times that he denied knowing him. I think this says so much about the risen Christ, always being faithful to us in spite of us denying Him and showing His confidence in each of us to renew ourselves and our love for Him.

Our parish as a stewardship parish has adopted three mission Churches in Haiti and have been supporting them over the years. Because of our support, I am convinced that Our Lord has richly blessed our parish. Upon the request of Fr. Michel, their pastor, some of our parishioners have also been supporting the education of some of their young people. Education is a way out of poverty and violence. This year we are hoping to expand this opportunity for six more students increasing our sponsorship from 29-35 students. Cost of a sponsorship is from \$325 to \$350. 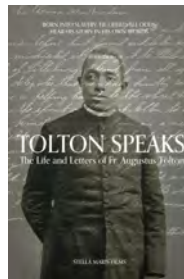
