

June 1, 2025 - Ascension of the Lord - C

#### A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Hail the Day that sees Him Rise! This weekend in the Provence of Chicago, we celebrate the Ascension of our Lord on this Seventh Sunday of Easter. The Ascension is not an ethereal exercise of doctrine sourced from a shared mystical experience on part of the disciples, lacking meaning or importance in our contemporary experience of faith. The prayers of this Mass remind us of the immanent importance of this mystery in the life of Christ to us today: where the Head has gone before in glory, the Body is called to follow in hope (collect), and he ascended, not to distance himself from our lowly state, but that we, his members, might be confident in following where he, our Head and Founder, has gone before (preface). The feast bids us to look forward to the final glorification of humanity — that those who follow Christ in his Death and Resurrection may know that the final destiny of the human person lies in the glory of heaven. We also are reminded that, despite going to heaven to sit at the right hand of God the Father, our Lord's promise to remain with us ushers in a new 'sacramental economy' entrusted to the Church from age to age. Only a few people could witness Jesus in his human body as he preached and taught and healed and travelled across the small parcel of land he inhabited for

the thirty-three years as he lived among us. But now, we encounter his True Body and Blood in our own time and place through the mystery of the Eucharist. We need not travel half-way across the world in order to encounter the one who, himself, baptizes and heals, forgives and makes holy. Through the presence of the Holy Spirit who continues to reveal God the Father and God the Son in the Body of the Church, we are not 'unlucky' for having been born in these later days. We can know God through the revelation of Scripture and Sacred Tradition of the Apostolic Witness.



Next weekend is JuneFest 2025 at St. Dominic School. There will be only a single Mass at 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, and it will be at St. Dominic School. (There will be no 6:30 p.m. Mass at St. Anthony!) We will run our regular Sunday morning schedule with Masses at 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. at St Anthony, but in recognition of many who will be working the festival on Saturday

night and working on the cleanup on Sunday morning, we will also have a 4:00 p.m. Mass on Sunday at St. Anthony. (Note the time... the late Sunday Mass is at a different time than in previous years.) We thank all who so generously work to put on Junefest. At this time, I am aware that organizers are still looking for volunteers for activities, as well as workers for set-up (Wednesday evening) and tear-down (Sunday morning).



Welcome to Fr. Daren Zehnle who will be covering Mass over this weekend and next week as I continue on my adventure in Alaska. Fr. Zehnle is the Campus Minister at Quincy University, He needs no introduction as a proud native of Quincy and a familiar face with Teens Encounter Christ. I encourage you to offer him congratulations for celebrating his 20th Anniversary of priestly ordination this week, as well, as we were classmates at Mundelein Seminary and members of the 2005 ordination class for the diocese.


