

- CHAPLAIN'S REFLECTION...

Some years ago, I gave a class on being a wise consumer of the news. It seems that those insights are as important now as ever.



- 1) The purpose of news programming The news media are about making money and not necessarily about telling you the truth. Indeed they often have little reverence for the facts, and use public events as the platform to spin a story, catch your eye, and sell advertising time to make money. Presenting "news" accurately is often much less important than capturing viewers. (And even more sadly their goal is often political - to sway public opinion to a certain point of view.)
- 2) In order to keep your attention the media toss "sound bites" at you, to catch your ear. Often the complexity of human events cannot be captured in headlines, and so the truth can often be a victim.
- 3) What the media chooses to report becomes the "news" while what they *ignore* remains unknown, important though that information might be!
- 4) The media are highly biased. They have a world view, often elitist, and filter all events through that view. For example 90% of news and television people have no religious commitment and so their reporting on religious events is often skewed.
- 5) The media, with 24 hours a day news programming, to fill their time often talk a topic to death, greatly distorting its real significance. What they choose to focus on is what the public believes is the "news." They often deliberately ignore "the rest of the story."
- 6) Internet platforms such as Facebook and YouTube and formerly Twitter (now "X"), are also often highly slanted and manipulate the truth. Powerful organizations flood these services with biased propaganda to sway public opinion.
- 7) A common victim of the press is the Catholic Church and moral living. Not only do they twist the facts but they also manipulate emotions. It is rare to find balanced reporting on issues of Faith, for most media figures have no background in a religious faith. Name the issue: vocations, priestly life, celibacy, money, same sex unions, morality. The church's position is neither presented accurately nor fairly. Ignorance reigns.

Knowledge of the truth is essential in making solid decisions as citizens in our society. Without a clear vision of the truth, society begins to crumble. (Do we not see that result all about us today?)

As the world and human events swirl around us. discerning the truth requires each of us to dig deeply and sift for the seed of truth in our news sources. Finding the truth in media coverage is like trying to read a sign through a very dirty window.

Can you ever trust the media? Perhaps the old Latin dictum says it best, Caveat emptor! ("Let the buyer beware!")

As Christians we have one great advantage in this discernment, and that is the clear truth of our Faith. As G. K. Chesterton once observed: "The Catholic Church is the only thing which saves a man from the degrading slavery of being a child of his age."

And we have the light of the Holy Spirit. Pray!
