Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

JUNE 15, 2025

Proverbs 8:22-31; Romans 5:1-5; John 16:12-15

From all eternity, there is only one God. From all eternity, there are Three Persons in this one God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. As far as their attributes, whatever can be said of the Father, can also be said of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

The Father is eternal, almighty, infinite in perfection; so also is the Son; so also is the Holy Spirit. But there are not three "almighties" or three "eternals," but only one almighty, eternal God infinite in perfection. The Father is not the Son is not the Holy Spirit. They are distinct Persons who share and completely possess the one nature of God.

From all eternity, the Father begets the Son; from all eternity, the Son is born of the Father. From all eternity, the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son. (The Oriental Churches express this as "from the Father through the Son.")

In time, about 7 B.C., only the Son became incarnate: The Word was made flesh. The Second Person of the Trinity became fully man without ceasing to be God. Jesus Christ is equal to the Father in his divinity, but less than the Father in his humanity: But he is One Person, ever to be adored in his majesty.

All of this is very heady theology! In fact, absolutely nothing is known of the Trinity in the Old Testament. Only Jesus reveals to us this central mystery of our faith. He revealed it as the practical basis of our spiritual life.

The Father loves us with an everlasting love; vet, in the Old Testament, he seems clouded in unapproachable light. We can scarcely visualize him as a Person. He seems so far above us.

The Eternal Son of God became man to show us the Father. When we see Jesus, we see the love of the Father. He is one of us. He is our access to the Father, our Mediator, our Savior. He assures us of the Father's forgiveness. He is the model of what God intended us to be. He gave his life for us. In him, we can have confidence in approaching the Father.

But we no longer see Jesus; he has returned to the glory of the Father. He has not left us orphans, however. He has sent the Holy Spirit, the "Paraclete." "Paraclete" means "one who stands by." He stands by us as our advocate, as our defense attorney against all the trials of this earth. He stands by us to comfort us and strengthen us. He stands by us to make us one in Christ Jesus. He manifests the Son to us, just as the Son manifested the Father.

In the Holy Spirit, we are joined with Mary and all the saints in Christ. Our spiritual life, then, must be rooted in the mystery of the Trinity. We give glory TO the Father, THROUGH the Son, IN the Holy Spirit, WITH the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints! Let us live and pray as we profess to believe.

The Most Holy Trinity Solemnity, June 15, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

On this Sunday after Pentecost, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. I don't know about you, but when I was in grade school the good sisters who taught us, the Ursuline nuns, would describe the doctrine of the Trinity as a mystery of our faith. We didn't quite understand that word "mystery" as it seemed to be a problem that challenged us to understand it. This was the farthest from the truth as our teachers would tell us that we needed to accept it as that mystery of our faith. After careful thought and a lot of questioning, this mystery was accepted as a doctrine not fully understood but somehow present in each of our lives. As our teachers stated, it was a mystery of faith and that we accepted. But our teachers would simply tell us that the simple sign of the cross would remind us of this mystery for we believed in the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, one God but three Persons. How can that be, we would never know. It was beyond our understanding. Thankfully, the gift of the Holy Spirit which came to the apostles that first Pentecost, would teach us to appreciate this truth of our faith and give us the grace to grow in our acceptance of it. And so, we gather to unite our prayer to the Father, through the Son, and with the gift of the Holy Spirit. And our God and His nature become a lived reality as indicated by our prayer.

Just to keep you informed our construction is becoming a reality and no longer a vision on paper. I was able to sign the final contract with Maas Construction and the diocese has given its final approval. Everything seems to be in order, and we look forward to our dream coming true in the months ahead. As many of you noticed, we recently completed the moving of our electrical and plumbing work which was necessary before any construction would begin. That is complete and now we will begin to see structure take place. Please pray for all of our workers. I continue to ask you, if you haven't done so, to honor your pledges as we try to complete our construction project. To all of you who have given, I thank you so much for your commitment and generosity.

I want to take this opportunity to thank so many of our parishioners for making last Sunday a day that I will always remember. I was so happy to celebrate my 50th anniversary as a priest with my home parish and you did not let me down. Our Mass with the choir, the musical instruments, and the differing songs made me so proud of our Church and the many voices that praised God through their talents of song. I also thank our ushers who were able to seat everyone, our servers, and all of our concelebrants. But most, thank God for our parishioners who showed me the love and support by their presence. Thank you too all! I would like to individually thank and recognize so many parishioners who made this day possible but in so doing I might forget someone, so I am choosing just to send a general thank you to all of our parish family. I was also very happy that the people of St. Anthony in Effingham as well as my family could experience this parish community alive and active as it was this past Sunday. I was so proud of this parish and hopefully our visitors experienced what I knew firsthand that St. Peter Church is a gem of a parish. May God bless each of you for your contribution in making last Sunday a day to remember for me, my family and for all involved. Thank you!






